## Explanatory Notes

If you are constructing a new dwelling in a rural area or have purchased an existing property that does not have a rural addressing number, you will need to apply for a rural addressing number to be allocated.

Rural addressing numbers are similar to street numbers as they identify your property for visitors and emergency service vehicles. The number however is based on a measured distance, usually from the beginning of the road; this makes it easy for people to locate the property quickly.

Property numbers are based on the distance of the entrance to a property from the start of a road. Odd numbers are on the left, even numbers on the right. For example, the number 327 refers to a property on the left side of a road 3.27 km from the road's beginning. Number 1026 is 10.26 km from the beginning of the road and on the right side, and number 2253 is on the left 22.53 km from where the road started.

All emergency services including Ambulance, Fire Brigades, and Police are familiar with this method of numbering and are supportive of it.

For a fee of $\$ 66.00$ Council Officers will allocate a number to your property and order a plate showing this number, when received we will forward the plate to you to be installed at the entrance of the property on a star picket or similar stand. The fee is payable with the application.
