## ANZAC DAY 2022



On Monday morning, 25 April around 70 people gathered at the Jerramungup War Memorial to pay their respects to those who have served and continue to serve our nation.

The service began at 6:00am with the Catafalque party, led by Mark Cruickshank, taking up their position followed by a welcome from Shire President Joanne Iffla.

The Anzac Day Requiem was then read by Bill Bailey before Rose Ganzer lead the crowd for the Prayer of Remembrance.

Following this, 13 stunning wreaths were laid at the War Memorial. The beautiful wreaths were once again prepared by Jess Bailey with her team of helpers, thank you ladies for volunteering your time to put these together. Shire CEO Martin Cuthbert then read the Ode before leading the crowd in a minutes silence.

After the New Zealand and Australian National Anthems were played Councillor Neil Foreman shared a moving tribute to Private David Raleigh Webster of Needilup. Private Webster served in Vietnam displaying magnificent courage in the face of an overwhelming battle called Operation Bribie. He was killed in action during Operation Bribie on 17 February 1967 but his acts of heroism and determination will never be forgotten. The full story of Private David Webster's life is included in the Jerry Journal. It was also a honour to have David's sister Julia Watts and her husband David travel from Vasse to attend our Dawn Service and lay wreaths on behalf of her brother and the Vietnam War.

Following the service a gunfire breakfast provided by the Shire was enjoyed inside the Rootpickers Hall. This was once again cooked by Jane Vandermaat, thank you for preparing such a delicious meal! Thank you also to everyone who helped in the kitchen, serving and cleaning up afterwards. The Shire would like to acknowledge and thank the teachers and students at Jerramungup District High School who prepared the fantastic artwork displayed inside the hall and School Captains Hunter Solomon and Gracie Aggiss who represented the school and laid a wreath.

Finally thank you to everyone who attended the service and paid their respects.

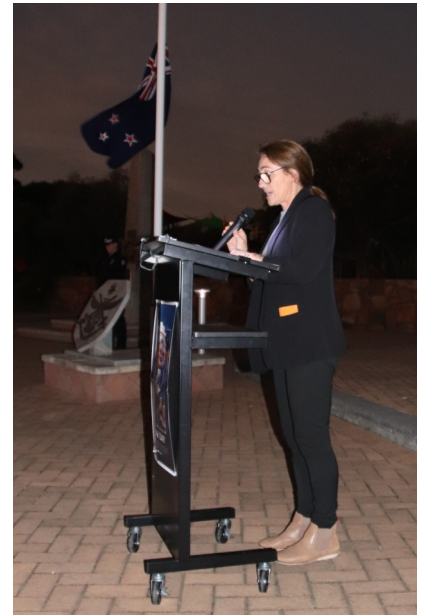

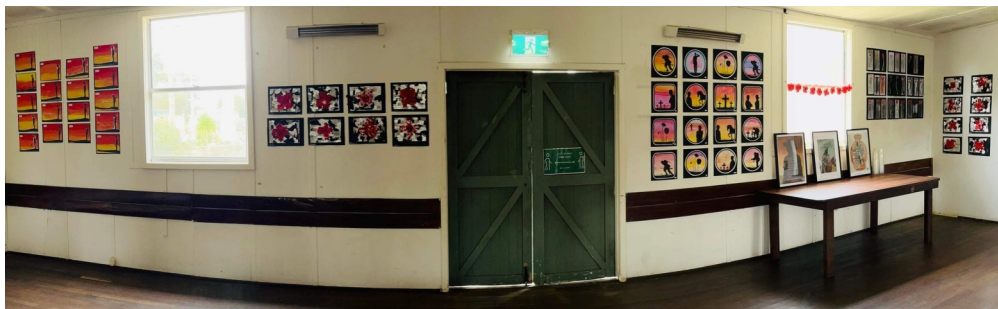

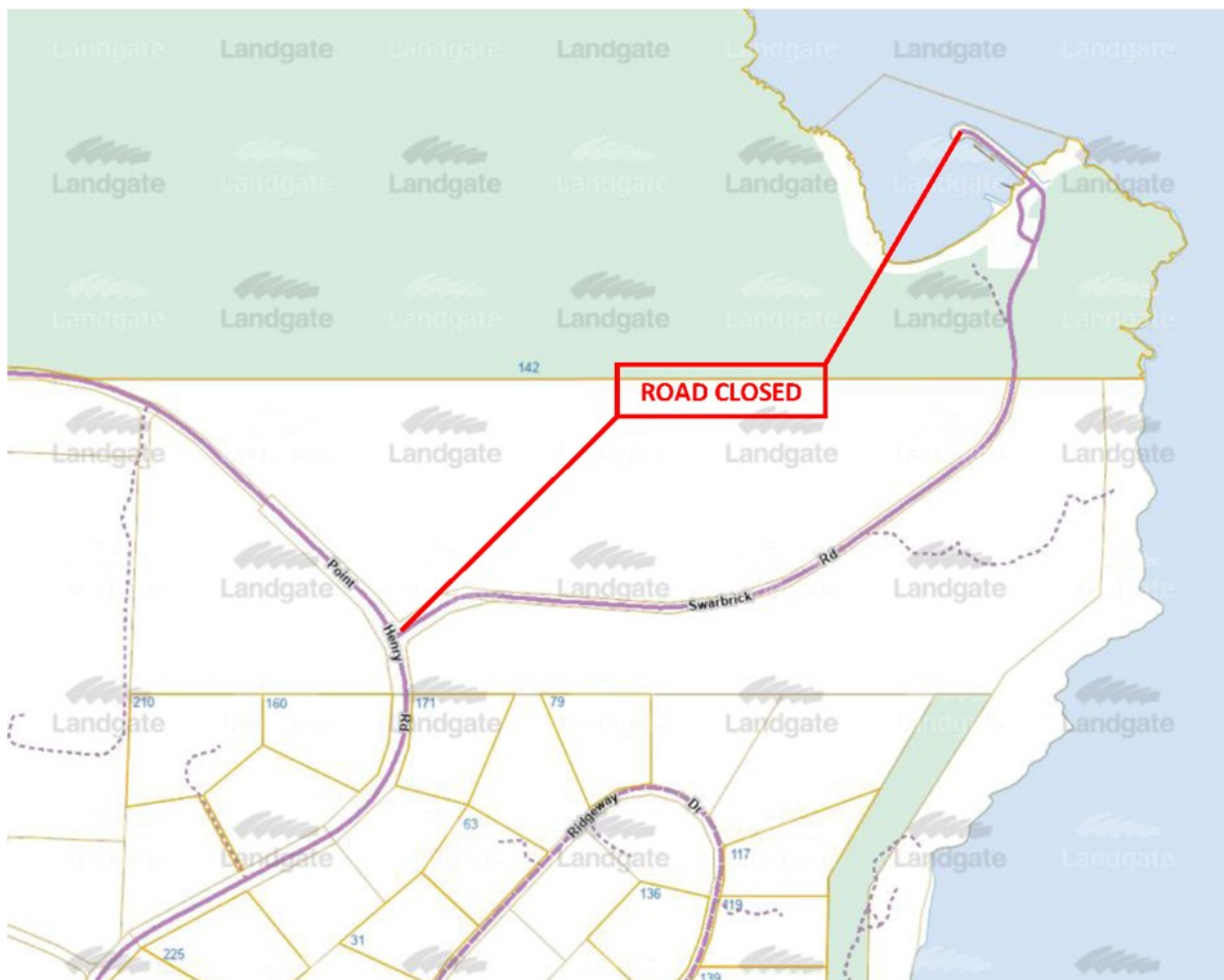


## PUBLIC NOTICE
