

FIRE CONTROL AND PREPAREDNESS INFORMATION

2025 - 2026

FIRST AND FINAL NOTICE

First and final notice has been served to all landowners and/or occupiers within the Shire of Jerramungup, who have the legal responsibility to prepare their properties to reduce the risk of outbreak and spread of fires.

As a measure to assist in the control of bushfires and pursuant to the powers contained in Section 33 of the Bush Fires Act 1954, you have a legal requirement to prepare and maintain your property for the fire season.

Your property must comply from 10 October 2025 and be maintained through to 30 April 2026.

Shire of Jerramungup officers and/or contractors are authorised to enter and remain upon private property, without notice to the owner, to inspect and confirm compliance with this Notice.

The owner or occupier of land who has received notice under Section 33(1) of the *Bush Fires Act 1954* and who fails to or neglects in any respect duly to comply with the requirements of the Notice is guilty of an offence and can be fined, including the recovery of costs incurred for any personnel, contractors or vehicles and machinery required to perform activities to bring the land into compliance.

Plantations (For the purpose of this notice is any area of planted hard- or softwood plants exceeding 3ha within townsite and exceeding 10ha outside a townsite and where the area planted exceeds 50m in any one direction until all stumps are removed or the land use has changed.)			15m wide, 5m high bare earth inside all external and public road facing boundaries. Where the plantation is divided into compartments: 6m wide, 5m high bare earth between compartments not exceeding 30ha in area 10m wide, 5m high bare earth between compartments where one or both exceed 30ha in area	Firefighting water supply facilities are designed and constructed so that 4x4 vehicles carrying 3,000 litres of water are able to access the facilities Install signage showing the locations of: compartments (name & number), water supply facilities, emergency access/egress, any structures, significant features Provide the Shire with a map of the plantation showing firebreaks and features requiring signage Firefighting equipment may need to be supplied and maintained

Access/driveway: An access to a property/dwelling that has a cleared width of 6m, 4m thereof being trafficable, a vertical clearance to vegetation of 5m and a maximum grade of 8 degrees.

Asset Protection Zone (APZ): A low fuel area immediately surrounding a building which is to be a minimum of 20m, increasing with slope. The Shire of Jerramungup may consider a lesser width as part of a variation or Bushfire Management Plan. Refer to "Planning for Bushfire Guidelines" for more information Bare earth break: A strip of land that has been cleared of all trees, bushes, grasses and any other object or thing or flammable vegetation material leaving clear bare mineral earth. Achievable by ploughing, grading or early spraying.

Dedicated water supply: water supply that is solely for firefighting purposes and accessible through a 50mm male camlock coupling with full flow valve. Requires a hard standing access adjacent to the water connection and must be readily identifiable.

Fire fuel: Any combustible material, dead or alive, in isolation or clusters or aggregation, that is likely to fuel a bushfire. Including but not limited to; heavy leaf litter on the ground, in gutters, fallen branches and any combustible material in clusters, all dry grasses exceeding a height of 100mm and any tree within the APZ

Parkland clearing: The selective removal of flammable shrubs and lower vegetation (ladder fuels), along with thinning out dense tree growth, to create a more open, park-like area. The goal is to reduce bushfire intensity by limiting ground-level fuel, while still maintaining some natural vegetation. This method is typically applied over larger areas beyond the immediate zone around buildings.

Turnaround: a three point or circular turnaround area, suitable for a heavy-duty fire truck, within 50m of a dwelling.
