DANIELLE WISEWOULD AWARDED THE ORDER OF ST JOHN



COMMUNITY REMINDER: VANDALISM AND THEFT OF PUBLIC INFRASTRUCTURE

The Shire has seen an increase in vandalism and theft of public infrastructure around Bremer Bay over the past month. This has included damage to, or removal of, signs, bollards and fencing across several locations.

These incidents come at a significant cost to the Shire and, ultimately, the community. Repairing and replacing damaged infrastructure requires staff time and resources, taking our teams away from other important maintenance and community works. There has been approximately \$4,000 spent on repairs and replacements this month alone.

Of particular concern is the recent removal of the rip warning sign at Native Dog Beach. This location has a history of serious water safety incidents, including fatalities, which is why this signage is so important. Removing safety warnings puts lives at risk.

The Shire asks the community to respect public infrastructure and to report any vandalism or suspicious behaviour. These assets are in place to keep everyone safe and to support the enjoyment of our shared spaces.

RECENT SHIRE WORKS

Town Services

Town Services staff have completed the following in Bremer Bay:

- Contract street sweeper has been through town site.
- Storm water drain pits along Margaret Street have been cleaned out removed sand/dirt and other material blocking up the storm water system.
- Pruning of vegetation growing alongside footpaths.
- Pruning of vegetation alongside walk trails.
- Removed fallen trees along estuary walk path.
- Pruning of low hanging branches within Paperbarks Park.
- Contractors have replaced damaged railing and planks at the board walk at Fisheries Beach.
- Mowing of parklands and around town site.
- Rubbish collection from Millers Point.
- Weed spraying and removal within town site.
- Weed control at Airstrip and around infrastructure.
- Mowing of parklands.
- Rubbish collection within town site.

Town Services staff have completed the following in Jerramungup:

- Weed spraying throughout the town site.
- Mowing of Parklands and cemetery.
- Weed control at the Airstrip.
- Mowing of old oval and clearing vegetation around water tanks.
- Cleaning off graffiti.
- Filling in potholes around the town site.
- Pruning of Biosphere gardens.
- Contractors have begun replacing damaged pram ramps around town.
- Contract street sweeper has been through town site.
- Rubbish collection within town site.
- · Weed spraying in gardens.

Road maintenance

The road maintenance grader has been working on Brook, Cuiss, Fitzgerald, Jacup North and South and other roads in that area, focussing on 'hot spot' areas as well as drains and backslopes.

The contract grader has been working on roads around Boxwood Hill and more recently Devil's Creek South and Murray Roads.

Road Construction


Base course preparation was completed on Thursday 27 November and the bitumen seal commenced as planned on 2 December and was completed on 4 December. Final trimming of shoulders, backslopes and driveways etc followed.

The crew is moving to Cuiss Road on 8 December to make a start there.

Bitumen seal also went down on the Bremer Bay street projects with kerbing and final asphalt seal to follow.

Fleet

The new excavator and tracked skid steer, replacing the backhoe and one of the Terex skid steers, arrived recently with the new six wheel tip truck arriving in the week commencing 8 December.


AUDIT FINDINGS RECEIVED AND ANNUAL FINANCIAL REPORT ADOPTED

At its December meeting, Council received the audit findings for the year ending 30 June 2025 and formally adopted the Shire's 2024/2025 Annual Financial Report.

The audit was carried out by Lincolns Accountants and Business Advisors on behalf of the Office of the Auditor General. No significant matters were identified, and Council accepted the findings as part of its commitment to transparent and responsible financial management.

The adopted Annual Financial Report forms part of the Shire's Annual Report, which outlines the Shire's key activities, projects and achievements for the past financial year. The report also measures progress against the Shire's Corporate Business Plan and meets all legislative reporting requirements.

PROPOSED ROAD DEDICATION AT BOXWOOD HILL

At its December meeting, Council considered a proposal to dedicate land at the intersection of Boxwood-Ongerup Road and Borden-Bremer Bay Road in Boxwood Hill as a road reserve.

The proposal relates to parts of proposed Lots 501 and 502 and would formally recognise the existing road connection as a dedicated road. This process helps ensure road access is properly established and managed into the future.

If progressed, the proposal will be publicly advertised and referred to relevant servicing authorities, with community submissions invited before any final decision is made.

HARVEST & VEHICLE MOVEMENT BAN

HOLIDAY WASTE MANAGEMENT IN BREMER BAY

To help manage increased waste volumes in Bremer Bay over the peak holiday period, the Shire will be implementing split bin collections from Tuesday 23 December through to Friday 30 January. A brochure with full details is available on the Shire's Facebook page and website, with hard copies also available from the Shire Administration Office and the Bremer Bay CRC.

In addition, the Bremer Bay Waste Transfer Station will operate with extended opening hours over the Christmas and January period to meet increased demand. The Jerramungup Waste Transfer Station will continue to operate as usual. Both Waste Transfer Stations will be closed on Christmas Day.

HOLIDAY PERIOD UPDATE

As the tourist season heats up and Bremer Bay welcomes more visitors over the Christmas and New Year period, the Shire's Ranger Services will be increasing patrols to help keep everyone safe and maintain the quality of our shared spaces. In addition to Shire Ranger David Myers, we will also have contract rangers patrolling the town over this period.

A reminder that there are no free camping sites in Bremer Bay or within 10 kilometres of any townsite. Unauthorized camping is not permitted, and Rangers will be monitoring for compliance. Please use designated caravan parks and campgrounds to avoid fines and help keep the area clean and enjoyable for everyone.

If you're visiting Bremer Bay's beaches this summer, look out for the green and red BEN signs, which stand for Beach Emergency Numbers. These signs are located at beach access points and key coastal spots around Bremer Bay and show a unique location code. In an emergency, calling 000 and quoting the nearest BEN sign code helps emergency services find you quickly. You can also find BEN sign locations in the SharkSmart WA app under the Report section, which includes a quick call button for emergencies.

Rangers also ask that dog owners keep their pets on a leash in designated areas and clean up after them to protect native wildlife and ensure public safety. Please observe all fire bans and local regulations regarding open fires and BBQs, as summer conditions increase fire risk and Rangers are vigilant in enforcing these rules. Please take your rubbish with you or use the bins provided, helping keep Bremer Bay clean for everyone to enjoy.
