

JERRAMUNGUP AWARDED \$100,000 FOR WATER INFRASTRUCTURE

The Shire of Jerramungup has secured \$100,000 through the Community Water Supplies Partnership program, part of a nearly \$1 million funding round supporting regional councils across WA.

This funding will be used to purchase a new water cart to help maintain emergency water supplies and support roadworks during dry periods.

The Shire thanks the WA and Commonwealth Governments for their support in improving water resilience in our community.

RECENT SHIRE WORKS

Town Services

- Town Services staff have completed the following in Bremer Bay:
- Pruning of vegetation growing alongside footpaths.
- Installed a skateboard repair station at the skate park and bicycle repair station at Paperbark Park.
- Removed washed out bollards and installed additional bollards to keep vehicles away from washed out edge along Wellstead Estuary.
- Pruning of vegetation along walk trails.
- Mowing of parklands and around townsite.
- Replaced damaged signage with new signage and poles.
- Weed spraying within townsite.
- Weed spraying along Wellstead Roads and Point Henry Road.
- Mowing of parklands.
- Rubbish collection within townsite.





Contractors have completed the following in Bremer Bay:

 Resurfaced, sealed and finished maintenance works at the skate park.

Road Construction

The Road Construction crew has been busy on Meechi Road completing drainage and forming up works. They are about halfway through the job with 2.5km of gravel in and mixed and laid out, so with all going well we are on track for the sealing on 2 December 2025.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT EXTRAORDINARY ELECTION 2026

Council resolved to declare the Electoral Commissioner responsible for conducting the 2026 Local Government Extraordinary Election.

The election will be held as a postal election to fill the remaining Councillor vacancy following the 2025 Ordinary Election.

The election is scheduled for Thursday, 26 March 2026, and the Shire has received a cost estimate of \$12,500 (ex GST) for conducting the postal vote. The decision supports transparency, accessibility, and efficient administration of the election process.

COUNCIL APPROVES LAND DISPOSITION FOR BREMER BAY GENERAL STORE RELOCATION

Council has agreed to relinquish its interest and surrender the management order over a 3,500m² parcel of land at Portion Reserve 51778, located at Bremer Bay Road and Seadragon Avenue in Bremer Bay.

This decision supports the relocation of the Bremer Bay General Store to the Town Centre, aligning with the 2012 Bremer Bay Town Centre Structure Plan and promoting future commercial development.

The land, currently reserved for government use, will be made available for purchase by the store proprietors through the Department of Planning, Lands and Heritage, enabling further growth and economic activity in the area.

This action reflects Council's commitment to sustainable planning and supporting local businesses.

NEW TEMPORARY ACCOMMODATION POLICY ADOPTED

Council has adopted Policy OP5 – Temporary Accommodation, setting clear rules for approving temporary accommodation in the Shire for up to 24 months. New application fees were also approved: \$125 for stays up to 30 days, \$600 for longer permits, and \$300 for renewals. The policy ensures a consistent, safe, and fair process for all temporary accommodation applications.

COUNCIL AWARDS TURF MANAGEMENT CONTRACT FOR SPORTING OVALS

At the recent meeting, Council accepted a quote from BGL Solutions for the provision of turf management services at the sporting ovals in Boxwood Hill, Jerramungup, and Bremer Bay.

BGL Solutions, who have been managing the Shire's sporting surfaces for the past twelve months, were the sole respondent to the Request for Quote (RFQ) process. Their performance over the past year has been highly professional and reliable, demonstrating strong expertise turf maintenance, restoration, and project management.

The contract covers a range of turf management tasks typical for sporting ovals, including regular maintenance, renovation, and coordination with local sports clubs to ensure minimal disruption during training and game days.

This 12-month contract is funded through Council's 2025/26 budget under parks and gardens allocations. The ongoing maintenance of these facilities supports community health and wellbeing by providing quality sporting grounds for local clubs and residents to enjoy.

Council has delegated the Chief Executive Officer to finalise and execute the contract, with minor variations if necessary, ensuring that the Shire continues to deliver high-quality maintenance of its valuable sporting assets efficiently and effectively.
