## SHIRE WORKS UPDATE



The Crew are currently installing the remaining Beach Emergency Numbers (BEN) Signage at remote beach locations unable to be accessed earlier due to wet conditions.

Repairs are also continuing on flood damaged sections of roads throughout the Shire utilising both Shire graders. Other ongoing works include routine maintenance grading, drain clearing and grading of road culverts and shoulders of roads to be resealed. They are currently also carting aggregate for resealing works. Contractors have completed maintenance grading around the Bremer Bay area.

The Town Services team are currently spraying weeds on road verges, air strips and other areas within the Shire along with mowing, gardening and general maintenance.

## UPCOMING FIRE BREAK INSPECTIONS

All land owners and occupiers in the Shire of Jerramungup are required to clear flammable material from firebreaks on or before the 4 October 2021, and thereafter maintain the firebreaks, up to and including the 29 April 2022.

Properties will be inspected for compliance between Monday 4 October and Friday 8 October and persons who fail to comply with the firebreak requirements of this Notice may be issued with an infringement notice (\$250) or the Shire of Jerramungup may carry out the required work on the land at cost to the owner/occupier.

Please refer to the 2021/22 Fire Control Information brochure for specific fire break requirements based upon your land usage and/or location. The Fire Control Information brochure can be found on our website or hard copies can be obtained from the Jerramungup Shire office or Bremer Bay Community Resource Centre.



#### RESTRICTED BURNING - ZONE 5 BREMER BAY/PT HENRY

A reminder that the restricted burning period (permits required), came into effect for Zone 5, Bremer Bay /Point Henry Peninsula on 1 September 2021.

Please see the map showing the Zone 5 area.

Please contact your local Fire Control Officer (FCO) for a permit to burn.

All other Zones within the Shire of Jerramungup are in the open season until 1 October 2021.

#### BASKETBALL FUN

A new basketball back board and hoop has also been installed at Pelican Park in Bremer Bay. Both of these were funded by the Local Roads and Community Infrastructure (LRCI) Program – Phase 2.





## FIGHT THE BITE

The current wet conditions have created ideal breeding environments for mosquitos and we have received reports of increasing numbers across the Shire.

In Western Australia, mosquitoes can transmit Ross River virus, Barmah Forest virus, Kunjin virus and the potentially fatal Murray Valley encephalitis virus. There is currently no cure and no vaccine for any mosquito-borne disease acquired in WA! The only way to prevent infection is to avoid being bitten by mosquitoes.

We are calling on the community to help fight the bite and prevent being bitten by following these 3 easy steps:

• Cover Up – wear long, loose-fitting, light coloured clothing, covering as much of the body as you can.

• Repel – When outdoors and mosquitoes are present, apply insect repellent containing DEET (diethyltoluamide) or picaridin evenly to exposed skin.

• Clean Up – simple changes around your home can reduce mosquito breeding. Remove, empty or cover water-holding containers.
