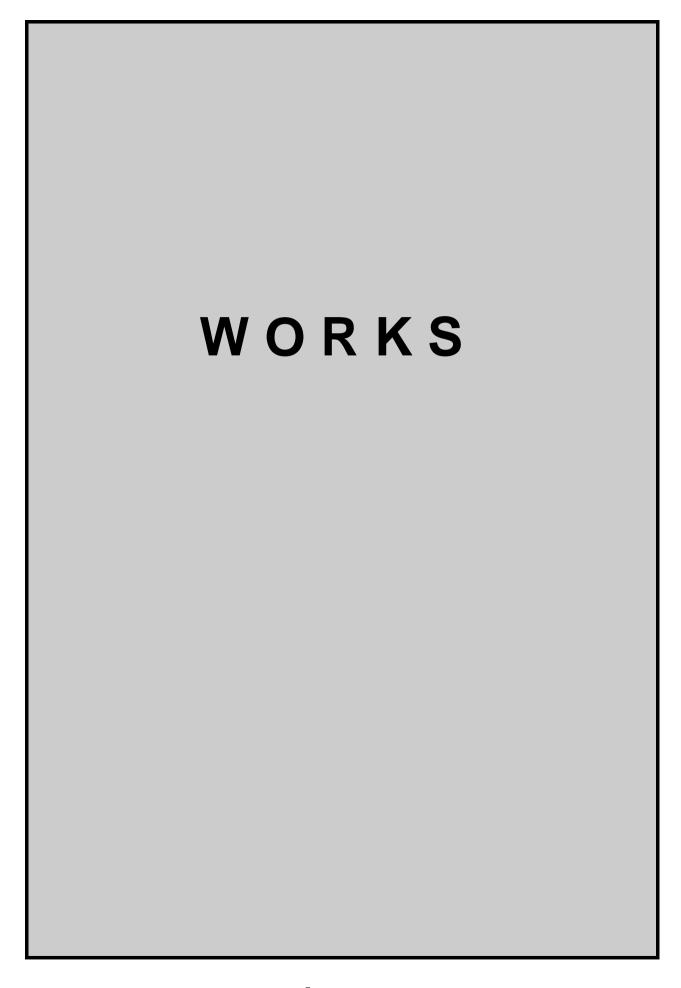

ROAD CONSTRUCTION

Foundation works on Devils Creek Road are complete with the crew completing all gravel hauling, spreading and compacting by early November. An upgrade of the existing drainage is also complete allowing the foundation to settle over the Christmas and harvest period prior to sealing. Sealing works will be carried out in early February with only a trim and tidy up required prior to sealing.

Works on Don Ende Drive are progressing well with gravel hauling 80% complete by the end of November. All foundation works will be complete before the Christmas break allowing the foundation to settle prior to sealing. Sealing works will be completed at the same time as Devils Creek Road works in early February.


Prior to Christmas the Construction crew will also carry out a tidy up of the gravel road network within and around Bremer Bay leaving the roads in the best possible shape prior to the holiday period.

Bremer Bay intersection works were also completed in late November with the crew assisting Fulton Hogan to supply and lay corrector coat and 30mm hot mix asphalt overlay on various intersections within Bremer Bay.

These intersections included Bremer Bay Road - Garnett Road, Bremer Bay Road - Wellstead Road, Bremer Bay Road - Frantom Way, Bennett Street - Clifton Avenue, Biddy Crescent - Barbara Street, Emma Street - Agnes Place and the Agnes Place culde-sac.

The intersection upgrades and asphalt overlay also included the re-alignment of the troublesome Mary Street - John Street intersection and re-aligning the intersection to a safer 'T' intersection.

ROAD MAINTENANCE

The Road Maintenance team has continued on their cycle around the Shire tending to harvest traffic maintenance.

The team has fixed problem areas on Swamp, Cowalellup & Meechi Roads before mobilising to Jerramungup and Jacup.

The team has been summer grading all roads systematically throughout the Jacup area cutting off areas with significant corrugations and patching blowouts in troublesome sandy areas.

Over the next months the team will be moving around the Shire catering for harvest traffic carrying out maintenance grading activities and then continuing on their cycle around the Shire.

TOWN SERVICES

The Town Services team has been busy finishing foundation works on the walk trail throughout November ready for asphalt in late November.

Stage 1 of this walk trail links Point Henry Road and the Bremer Bay Beaches Resort & Tourist Park back to White Trail Road (about 1800m) with Stage 2 linking from White Trail Road back to the town centre.

The team has carried out an excellent job with many hurdles to overcome on the section adjacent Wellstead Road. Asphalt was laid on the path in late November leaving the

team with only bollarding, signage and a final tidy up prior to the opening before Christmas. Some minor flood damage impacted the trail on Saturday 5th December however this will be repaired in the next two weeks.

Over the coming the month the team will be prioritising completing works on the walk trail as well as preparation of both town site parks and gardens prior to the holiday period.

SUMMARY

Council is to consider amending the Shire's "Planning Framework' to zone the north-west portion of Lot 1281 South Coast Highway, Jerramungup to accommodate land uses that require highway frontage and large floor area such as a machinery dealership.

In order to achieve this, the following amendments are required:

- 1. Amend the Local Planning Strategy to:
 - Review the current status of industrial and commercial land in the Jerramungup townsite; particularly land use with large floor space and land area needs; and
 - Recognise the issues around the shortage of available land for this purpose and the increasing need to trade to passing traffic.
- 2. Initiate Scheme Amendment 11 to the Shire of Jerramungup Local Planning Scheme No 2 to rezone the north-west portion of Lot 1281 South Coast Highway, Jerramungup from the 'Rural' zone to 'Special Use Zone No.9'

This report recommends that the amendments be initiated and referred to the Department of Planning for permission to advertise and the Environmental Protection Authority.

BACKGROUND

Local Planning Strategy

The Local Planning Strategy is the 20year land use plan for the Shire of Jerramungup. It is intended to set out Council's general objectives, aims and intentions for long term growth and change. All future development and zoning of land is guided by the Local Planning Strategy (the Strategy).

There is limited discussion in the Strategy regarding the availability of land for industrial and large lot commercial development in Jerramungup. A recent examination of

industrial and commercial land availability within the townsite has confirmed that there is a chronic shortage of available land.

The Shire has been working for a number of years to ensure that there is enough land available for industrial and commercial land uses in order to support the population and prosperity of the Jerramungup townsite. Land is needed to allow for new business to locate and existing business to expand.

Although there are a number of sites zoned for light or general industrial activity in the townsite they have the following issues that have prevented their development over time:

- Many of the lots are Unallocated Crown Land (UCL) and the process to gain management of this land by the Shire has been underway since at least 2008.
 Native Title and servicing issues (mostly with the Water Corporation), have prevented this land becoming available to date.
- The proximity of the 'General Industry' zoned lots to the existing residential areas and caravan park in Jerramungup can limit the land uses that can develop;
- Many of the lots within the town are too small to cater for land uses such as transport depots and machinery dealerships.
- The lack of exposure to the South Coast Highway due to the vegetated buffer surrounding and screening the townsite from the highway. Jerramungup is located strategically at the crossroads of major highways with high numbers of passing traffic and is central to a reasonably large rural catchment. A buffer was established around the town site at its inception for the likely reason to increase residential amenity. Unfortunately, as the population in the townsite has decreased over time the businesses in Jerramungup have become increasingly reliant on passing trade. The buffer around town has screened the town from passing traffic and made it difficult for existing business to gain access to the considerable passing traffic and makes the townsite less attractive to new business looking to establish.
- Demand for industrial and commercial land in Jerramungup is largely driven at this stage by the transport companies seeking to take advantage of Jerramungup's highway location.

In response to this shortage the following actions have been pursued so far:

- Negotiations with the Department of Lands for management of UCL in the townsite have been ongoing since 2008 and only now look more likely with timeframes placed on native title resolution and resolution of issues around the availability of water with Water Corporation. These lots would still have limitations due to their proximity to the Caravan Park and residential areas and smaller lot size.
- Scheme Amendment 10 was initiated by Council in May 2015 to rezone portions
 of the vegetated buffer around the townsite for industrial purposes, whilst
 retaining a landscaped strip to the highway for amenity reasons. This rezoning
 will facilitate the minor expansion of two existing businesses in town and free up
 some additional land.

The Strategy does not expand on this issue of industrial and commercial land availability to any great extent. It currently identifies existing light and general industrial lots but does not explore the issues and difficulties around actually developing this land.

In favour of the proposed industrial rezoning's the Strategy 2 of the "Strategies and Actions for the Jerramungup Townsite" does states:

"Facilitate business opportunities and industrial development which will deliver diverse employment opportunities and support development in the district.

Actions

- Maximise the development potential of existing lots and encourage new developments by streamlining planning processes.
- Provide for the needs of light and general industry to support the community.
- Provide appropriate buffers and/ or treatments between industry and any sensitive land uses, so as to avoid land use conflicts.
- Seek funding opportunities to liaise with key stakeholders and major businesses and actively promote Jerramungup as a small business centre.
- Continue to pursue partnerships Federal and State bodies for business development and promotion."

Part Lot 1281 South Coast Highway, Jerramungup

Part Lot 1281 South Coast Hwy, Jerramungup is currently zoned 'Rural' and used for broad-hectare farming. There is an effluent pond in the north western corner of the site that receives treated waste water from the Jerramungup effluent disposal scheme.



Part Lot 1281 South Coast Highway – 12.5ha portion for industrial and commercial land uses

The portion of land in question slopes gently to the east and is located away from the effluent disposal ponds and outside of a dam catchment to the south. It maximises highway frontage and would cater for businesses that require large floor space such as transport depots and a machinery dealership.

CONSULTATION

Should Council agree to pursue the scheme amendment it will require consultation with affected government agencies and the local community as required by statutory processes.

COMMENT

The Proposal

There is a chronic shortage of available, appropriately zoned land to cater for industrial and commercial land uses that require large floor space or land area in Jerramungup.

In order to accommodate the zoning changes to fix this situation the following steps need to be taken:

- 1. Local Planning Strategy needs to be amended to provide more discussion around the lack of appropriate land zoned for industrial and large scale commercial type uses; and
- 2. It is proposed to rezone part of Lot 1281 South Coast Highway, Jerramungup (Lot 1281) for industrial and commercial type land uses that require either large floor space or land area.

Local Planning Scheme Amendment

In order to support proposed Scheme Amendment 11 (as below) and Scheme Amendment 10 (industrial expansion into the townsite buffer) the Local Planning Strategy should be amended to include:

- Discussion on the availability of industrial and commercial land;
- Discussion on the desirability of retaining the townsite buffer, the need to create more industrial land and increase the townsite's exposure to passing trade; and
- Amend 'Figure 29 Jerramungup Strategy Map' to include Scheme Amendments 10 & 11.

Scheme Amendment No.11

Negotiations with the owner of Lot 1281 South Coast Highway, Jerramungup have identified a 12.5hectare portion of land with highway frontage and strong links back into the townsite as being available for this type of development.

Scheme Amendment 11 proposes to:

- 1. Rezone a 12.5 hectare portion of Lot 1281 from the 'Rural' zone to 'Special Use Zone No.9'
- 2. Establish a new 'Special Use Zone No.9' with the following requirements:
 - A. The purpose is to provide for light and service industry, storage, wholesaling, showrooms, trade and professional services which, by reason of their scale, character, operational or land requirements, are not generally appropriate to be accommodated within the 'Town Centre' zone or the existing industrial area.
 - B. The land uses that may occupy the zone include:
 - Industry Light;
 - Industry Rural;

- Industry Service;
- Motor Vehicle, Boat and Caravan Sales
- Motor Vehicle Repair
- Showroom;
- Storage
- Transport Depot.
- Warehouse
- C. Conditions of development include:
 - i) All use and development requires Planning Approval.
 - ii) Prior to any use commencing on the site a development plan shall be submitted and approved by the Local Government. This plan shall show:
 - The items required in Clause 10.2 of the Scheme;
 - On site stormwater disposal and bio retention measures:
 - A minimum building setback of 20m from the western boundary; and
 - Details of proposed fencing and signage.
 - iii) Development shall occur in accordance with the approved plan.
 - iv) The design of any buildings and/or development is to include specific measures to ensure development addresses the highway to a high standard.

This scheme amendment would allow for:

- The creation of additional land for new and existing businesses that require additional land area in which to operate such as a machinery dealership or transport depot;
- A high standard of development fronting the South Coast Highway; and
- A 'Special Use' zone is proposed rather than a 'General Industry' zone so as to have greater control over the standard of development addressing the highway in what would be a high profile site.

Justification

With rural populations declining over many years due to increasing farm size and slow migration toward the regional centres Jerramungup needs to establish itself as a service centre in the immediate region. This would assist in retaining or growing population in the town and would improve services available to the surrounding agricultural industry. In order to do Jerramungup has two issues to address:

- 1. The availability of land for large scale business with large floor space requirements; and
- 2. The need to increasingly trade to passing traffic to keep local business viable.

There clearly needs to be land available for business that supports the immediate region such as a machinery dealership and transport depots. Council has seen a number of enquiries from existing business within town to expand their businesses. However, there is no freehold land available.

The existing transport depots are straining for room and new highway frontage land could serve to attract new business to town. Part Lot 1281 provides reasonably unencumbered land, with good distance to residences, highway frontage and can be easily serviced.

Jerramungup is well located at the junction of two highways. However, the townsite is largely screened from these roads and business has poor exposure to passing traffic. Zoning a portion of Lot 1281 for industrial and commercial uses and reducing/modifying the buffer around the townsite would help to address this shortcoming.

Issues

Access

The number of access points will need to be minimised to meet Main Roads WA requirements. Service roads or similar outcomes are likely to be required.

Services

Power is available in the highway reserve, water will need to be extended and negotiated with Water Corporation during the processing of the amendment. Effluent disposal will be onsite and ideally make use of the effluent ponds to the north.

If required, one option for non-potable water may be treating the water from the effluent pond.

Land Capability

Council engaged Bio Diverse Solutions to prepare a land capability report over Lot 1281 in 2010. This study showed no issues with distance to ground water or soil characteristics that would prevent the further development of the site.

Effluent Disposal Ponds

All dwellings are connected to a limited sewerage system operated by the Shire. The Shire has an operating licence from the Economic Regulation Authority (ERA) for sewerage and non-potable water services.

A portion of the Jerramungup townsite sends leachate from septic tanks to an evaporation pond immediately to the north of the subject site. It should be noted that although the ponds are referred to as 'effluent ponds' they do not have any odour impact and do not contain any waste materials.

There are no generic buffer separation distances required by the EPA and impact on the subject site would be minimal.

Conclusion

The proposed scheme amendment would support the expansion of existing business, attract new business not currently able to be catered for and ensure a high standard of development. The subject site is reasonably unencumbered, easily serviced and has good highway frontage.

To support the scheme amendment the Local Planning Strategy will need to be amended to ensure that the Shire's whole planning framework aligns. The amendment to the Local Planning Strategy would acknowledge that:

- There are difficulties in finding enough land to accommodate and uses that require large floor space; and
- The townsite's location at the junction of two highways and the increasing need to trade to passing traffic means that the vegetated buffer around the town needs

to be modified to increase exposure whilst balancing this with retaining a high level of amenity.

STATUTORY REQUIREMENTS

Following Council's resolution to prepare (initiate) an amendment the following process is required:

- 1. Council formally resolves to adopt the Amendment;
- 2. Where the Amendment is inconsistent with the approved Local Planning Strategy Council must refer the Amendment to the Planning Commission for consent to be advertised. This must include reasons justifying why a variation to the Planning Strategy should occur.
- 3. Council must also refer the Amendment to the EPA for assessment:
- 4. Once the Planning Commission has agreed that the Amendment can be advertised, then Council undertakes this for a period of 42 days. The advertising also includes referral to all relevant government agencies.
- 5. Following the advertising the Council must consider any submissions which have been received and it must resolve to accept or dismiss each submission. At the same time Council must resolve to adopt the Amendment for final approval with or without modifications:
- 6. The Amendment is submitted to the Planning Commission which makes a recommendation to the Minister for Planning;
- 7. The Minister determines to approve or refuse the Amendment. Often the Minister will require the Amendment to be modified before approval is given:
- 8. Once approved by the Minister, the Council must publish a notice is in the Government Gazette.

Aspiration 9: An economically diverse community where primary industry is supported by a strong secondary and service industry.

RECOMMENDATION

That Council,

- 1. Initiate Scheme Amendment No 11 to the Shire of Jerramungup Local Planning Scheme No 2 pursuant to Section 75 of the Planning and Development Act 2005 by;
 - i) Rezoning Part Lot 1281 South Coast Highway, Jerramungup from the 'Rural' zone to Special use Zone No.9;
 - ii) Modifying Schedule 4 Special Use Zones in accordance with Attachment 10.3.1:
 - iii) Amending the Scheme Maps accordingly.
- 2. That Council adopts Scheme Amendment No 11 for the purpose of advertising and referral to the Environmental Protection Authority.
- 3. That Council refers Scheme Amendment No.11 to the Western Australian Planning Commission for consent to be advertised.
- 4. That Council resolves to modify the Local Planning Strategy as follows:
 - a) Updating Section 8.2.2 Constraints (Jerramungup Townsite) to:
 - Include discussion on the availability of industrial and commercial land, particularly for land use that has large land area and/or floor space requirements;
 - Include discussion on the screening effect of the townsite buffer and its detrimental impact upon the townsite's exposure to passing trade;
 - b) Add new clause '8.2.3.10 Area 10: Townsite Buffer' and include discussion on the need to amend this buffer to increase exposure to passing traffic whilst balancing this with protection of flora, fauna and amenity of the townsite.



STATUTORY REQUIREMENTS

The following sections of the Local Government Act have relevance:

5.3. Ordinary and special council meetings

- (1) A council is to hold ordinary meetings and may hold special meetings.
- (2) Ordinary meetings are to be held not more than 3 months apart.
- (3) If a council fails to meet as required by subsection (2) the CEO is to notify the Minister of that failure.

5.4. Calling council meetings

An ordinary or a special meeting of a council is to be held

(a) if called for by either

- (i) the mayor or president; or
- (ii) at least 1/3 of the councillors,

in a notice to the CEO setting out the date and purpose of the proposed meeting; or

(b) if so decided by the council

5.5. Convening council meetings

- (1) The CEO is to convene an ordinary meeting by giving each council member at least 72 hours' notice of the date, time and place of the meeting and an agenda for the meeting.
- (2) The CEO is to convene a special meeting by giving each council member notice, before the meeting, of the date, time, place and purpose of the meeting.

The Local Government (Administration) Regulations provide:

12. Public notice of council or committ	ee meetings 🗆 s. 5.25(1)(g)
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- (1) At least once each year a local government is to give local public notice of the dates on which and the time and place at which \Box
- (a) the ordinary council meetings; and
- (b) the committee meetings that are required under the Act to be open to members of the public or that are proposed to be open to members of the public,

are to be held in the next 12 months.

- (2) A local government is to give local public notice of any change to the date, time or place of a meeting referred to in subregulation (1).
- (3) Subject to subregulation (4), if a special meeting of a council is to be open to members of the public then the local government is to give local public notice of the date, time, place and purpose of the special meeting.
- (4) If a special meeting of a council is to be open to members of the public but, in the CEO's opinion, it is not practicable to give local public notice of the matters referred to in subregulation (3), then the local government is to give public notice of the date, time, place and purpose of the special meeting in the manner and to the extent that, in the CEO's opinion, is practicable.

The Local Government Act provides that local public notice is as follows;

1.7. Local public notice

- (1) Where under this Act local public notice of a matter is required to be given, a notice of the matter is to be \Box
- (a) published in a newspaper circulating generally throughout the district;
- (b) exhibited to the public on a notice board at the local government's offices; and
- (c) exhibited to the public on a notice board at every local government library in the district.
- (2) Unless expressly stated otherwise it is sufficient if the notice is
- (a) published under subsection (1)(a) on at least one occasion; and
- (b) exhibited under subsection (1)(b) and (c) for a reasonable time, being not less than
- (i) the time prescribed for the purposes of this paragraph; or
- (ii) if no time is prescribed, 7 days.

 - (b) is satisfied with the proposed arrangements relating to the person's employment.
- (4) Unless subsection (5A) applies, if the position of CEO of a local government becomes vacant, it is to be advertised by the local government in the manner prescribed, and the advertisement is to contain such information with respect to the position as is prescribed.
- (5A) Subsection (4) does not require a position to be advertised if it is proposed that the position be filled by a person in a prescribed class.
 - (5) For the avoidance of doubt, subsection (4) does not impose a requirement to advertise a position before the renewal of a contract referred to in section 5.39.


