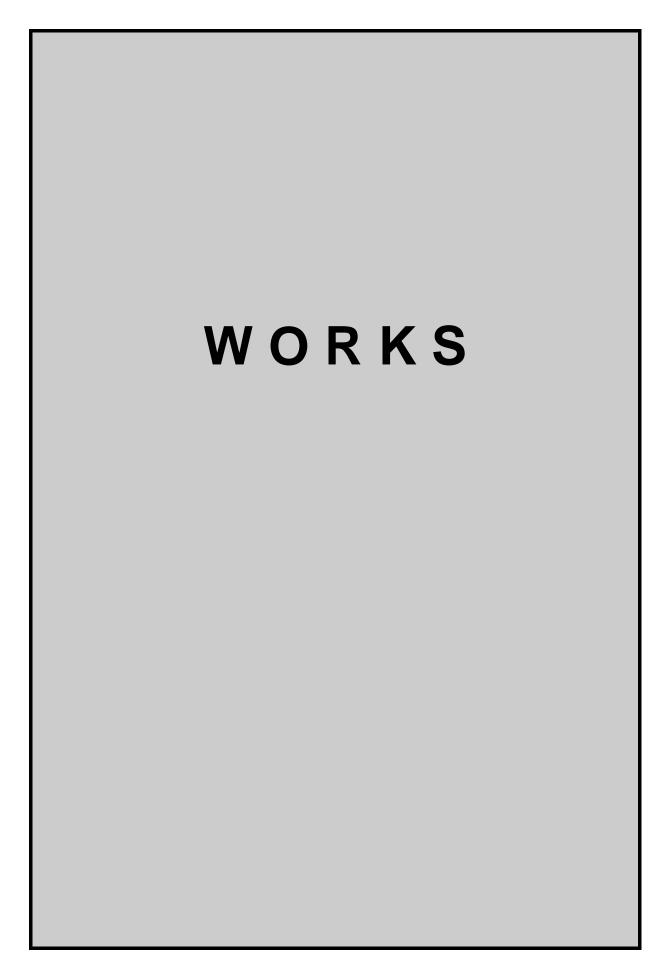

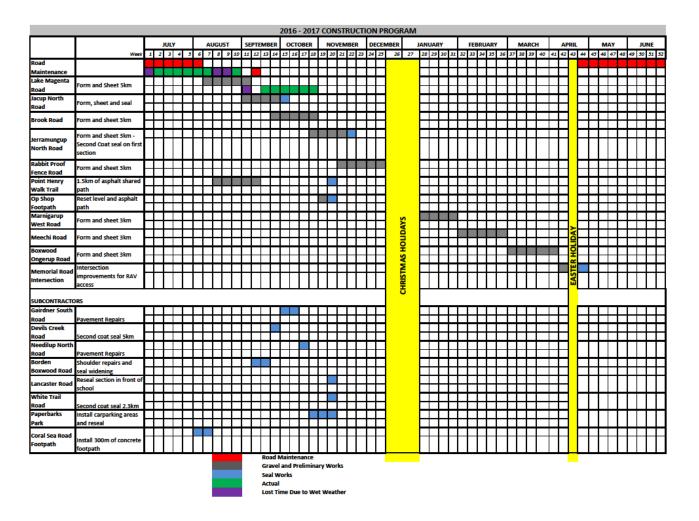
#### **ROAD CONSTRUCTION**

The Construction crew have been gravel sheeting Lake Magenta Road and these works will be completed in early November. The widened pavement will significantly improve this section of road which had a considerable number of pavement failures. The vegetation on this section of road was pruned instead of the traditional clearing method which has constrained the finished design with increased shoulder and batter slopes to accommodate the new running surface.

Local contractors have commenced works on local roads that were severely affected by the flood event in January 2016. The remaining flood damage works will be undertaken by contractors in the near future.

Focus is still on obtaining appropriate approvals to undertake future works which has been challenging given the extent of surveys and information gathering required to obtain approvals to current standards.

Refer below for the completed 2016 / 2017 construction program:



#### **ROAD MAINTENANCE**

The roadside spraying program which was hampered by wet weather in recent months finally commenced in October to address the substantial weed infestations due to the wet conditions.

Routine Maintenance grading and gravel patching was undertaken on roads in the Bremer Bay area to address those sections of road damaged due to the recent rain events. This has kept the crew busy maintaining our roads in a safe condition for motorists.

The crew are still focused on clearing of back-slopes especially on bends and intersections to improve sight distances for the road user.

#### **TOWN SERVICES**

The town services team commenced repairs on potholes in Jerramungup and Bremer Bay townsites since the weather has improved. The crew will be focused on repairing the remaining potholes on sealed roads in the coming weeks and once again the community's patience has been appreciated. The team will also focus on the weed infestations as a result of the rains and maintenance of the parks and gardens in Jerramungup and Bremer Bay.

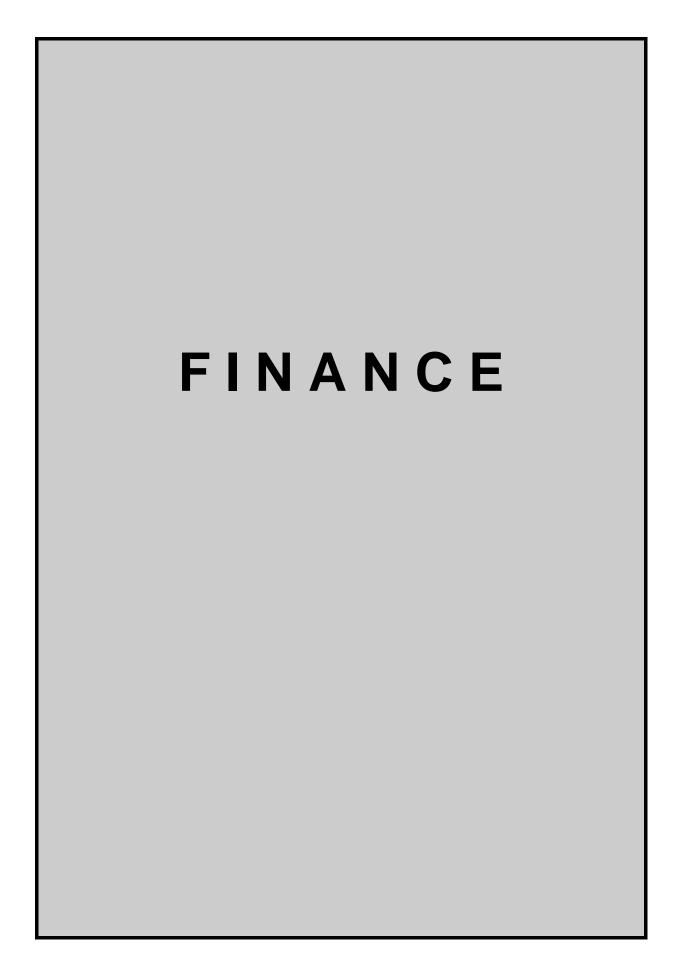

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# 1. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The significant accounting policies which have been adopted in the preparation of this statement of financial activity are:

(a) Basis of Accounting
This statement is a special purpose financial report, prepared in accordance with applicable Australian
Australian Accounting Standards, other mandatory professional reporting requirements and the Local Government Act 1995 (as amended) and accompanying regulations (as amended).

(b) The Local Government Reporting Entity All Funds through which the Council controls resources to carry on its functions have been included in this statement.

In the process of reporting on the local government as a single unit, all transactions and belances between those funds (for example, loans and transfers between Funds) have been eliminated.

All monies held in the Trust Fund are excluded from the statement, but a separate statement of those monies appears at Note 11.

(c) Rounding Off Figures
All figures shown in this statement are rounded to the nearest dollar.

(d) Rates, Grants, Donations and Other Contributions Safes, grants, donations and other contributions are recognised as revenues when the local government obtains control over the assets comprising the contributions. Control over assets acquired from rates is obtained at the commencement of the rating period or, where earlier, upon recept of the rates.

# (e) Goods and Services Tax

second and service is an iss. In accordance with recommended practice, revenues, expenses and assets capitalised are stated net of any GST recoverable. Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of applicable GST.

(f) Cash and Cash Equivalents Cash and cash equivalents comprise cash at bank and in hand and short-term deposits that are readily convertible to known amounts of cash and which are subject to an insignificant risk of changes in value.

For the purposes of the Cash Flow Statement, cash and cash equivalents consist of cash and cash equivalents as defined above, net of outstanding bank overdrafts. Bank overdrafts are included as short-term borrowings in current liabilities.

# (g) Trade and Other Receivables

Trade recovables, which generally have 30 - 90 day terms, are recognised initially at fair value and subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest rate method, less any allowance for uncollectible amounts.

Collectability of trade receivables is reviewed on an ongoing basis. Debts that are known to be uncollectable are written off when identified. An allowance for doubtful debts is raised when there is objective evidence that they will not be collectable.

# 1. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (Continued)

(h) Inventories General Inventories are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Net realisable value is the estimated saling price in the ordinary course of business less the estimated costs of completion and the estimated costs of necessary to make the usle.

Inventories held from trading are classified as current even if not expected to be realised in the next 12 months.

# Land Held for Resale

Land purchased for development and/or resale is valued at the lower of the cost and net realisable value.

Cost includes the cost of acquisition, development and interest incurred on the financing of that land during
its development. Interest and holding charges incurred after development is complete are recognised as

Revenue arising from the sale of property is recognised in the operating statement as at the time of signing a binding contract of sale.

Land held for resale is classified as current except where it is held as non-current based on Council's intentions to release for sale.

# (i) Flood Assets

Flood Assets
All assets are initially recognised at cost. Cost is determined as the fair value of the assets given as consideration plus costs incidental to the acquisition. For assets acquired at no cost or for nominal consideration, cost is determined as fair value at the date of acquisition. The cost of non-current assets constructed by the local government incides the cost of all materials used in the construction, direct labour on the project and an appropriate proportion of variable and fixed overhead.

Certain asset classes may be revalued on a regular basis such that the carrying values are not materially different from fair value. Assets carried at fair value are to be revalued with sufficient regularity to ensure the carrying amount does not differ materially from that determined using fair value at reporting date.

(j) Depreciation of Non-Current Assets All non-current assets having a limited useful life are systematically depreciated over their useful lives in a manner which reflects the consumption of the future economic benefits embodied in those assets.

(k) Trade and Other Payables Trade and other payables are carried at amortised cost. They represent liabilities for goods and services provided to the local government prior to the end of the financial year that are unpaid and arise when the Shire becomes obliged to make future payaments in respect of the purchase of these goods and services. The amounts are unsecured and are usually paid within 30 days of recognition.

(i) Employee Benefits
The provisions for employee benefits relates to amounts especial to be paid for long service leave, armuel leave, wages and salaries and are calculated as follows:

(i) Wages, Salaries, Annual Leave and Long Service Leave (Short-term Benefits) The provision for employees' benefits to wages, salaries, annual leave and long sentce leave expected to be settled within 12 months represents the amount the Shine has a present obligation to pay resulting from employees services provided to belience date. The provision has been calculated at nominal amounts based on remarked ton rates the Shine expects to pay and includes related on-costs.

# (iii) Annual Leave and Long Service Leave (Long-term Benefits)

Annual Leave and Long Service Leave [Long-term Benefits]. The lability for long service leave in recognised in the provision for employee benefits and measured as the present value of expected future payments to be made in respect of services provided by employees up to the reporting date using the project unit credit method. Consideration is given to expected future wage and using leaves, experience of employee departures and periods of services. Depacted future payment are discounted using market yields at the reporting date on national government bonds with terms to maturity and currency that match as closely as possible, the estimated future cash outflows. Where the Shire does not have the unconditional right to defer settlement beyond 12 months, the liability is recognised as a current liability.

(m) Interest-bearing Loans and Borrowings All loans and borrowings are initially recognised at the fair value of the consideration received less directly attributable transaction costs.

After initial recognition, interest-bearing loans and borrowings are subsequently measured at amortises cost using the effective interest method. Fees paid on the establishment of loan facilities that are yeld related are included as part of the carrying emount of the loans and borrowings.

Borrowings are classified as current liabilities unless the Council has an unconditional right to defer settlement of the liability for at least 12 months after the balance sheet date.

# **Borrowing Costs**

Borrowing costs are recognised as an expense when incurred except where they are directly attributable to the acquisition, construction or production of a qualifying asset. Where this is the case, they are capitalised as part of the cost of the particular asset.

Provisions are recognised when: The council has a present legal or constructive obligation as a result of past events; it is more likely than not that an outflow of resources will be required to settle the obligation; and the amount has been reliably estimated. Provisions are not recognised for future operating losses.

Where there are a number of similar obligations, the likelihood that an outflow will be required in settlement in determined by considering the class of obligations as a whole. A provision is necognised even if the likelihood of an outflow with respect to any one of item included in the same class of obligations may be terrall.

(c) Current and Non-Current Classification in the determination of whether an asset or liability is current or non-current, consideration is given to the time when each asset or islability is expected to be settled. The asset or liability is classified as current if it is expected to be settled within the next 12 months, being the Council's operational cycle. In the if it is expected to be settled within the next 12 months, being the Council's operational cycle. In the case of subtlines where Council down not have the unconditional right to delete settlement beyond 12 months, such as vested long service leave, the liability is classified as current even if not expected to be settled within the next 12 months. Inventories held for trading are classified as current even if not expected to be realised in the next 12 months accept for land held for resale where it is held as non current based on Council's intentions to release for sale.

# (p) Nature or Type Classifications

Rates
All rates levied under the Local Government Act 1395, includes general, differential, specific area nates, minimum rates, interim nates, back rates, es-grata rates, less discounts offered. Exclude administration fees, interest on installments, interest on arrears, service charges and sesserage rates.

Operating Grants, Subsidies and Contributions
Refer to all amounts received as grants, subsidies and contributions that are not non-operating grants.

Non-Operating Grants, Subsidies and Contributions

Amounts received specifically for the acquisition, construction of new or the upgrading of non-current
assets paid to a local government, irrespective of whether these amounts are received as capital grants,
subsidies, contributions or donations.

Profit on the disposal of assets including gains on the disposal of long term investments. Losses are disclosed under the expenditure classifications.

Fees and Charges
Revenues (other than service charges) from the use of facilities and charges made for local government services, seewrage rates, retrials, have charges, fee for service, photocopying charges, licences, sale of goods or information, frees, penalties and administration fees. Local governments may wish to disclose more detail such as rubbish collection fees, rental of property, fines and penalties, other fees and charges.

Service Charges

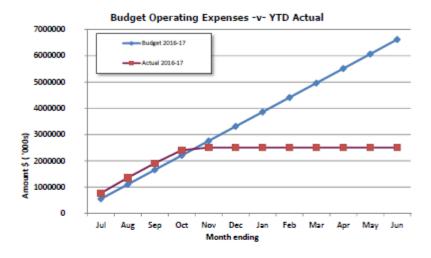

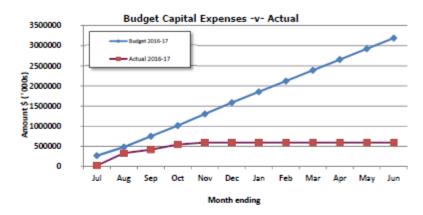

# **SUMMARY**

Council adopted the Point Henry Fire Management Strategy as a Local Planning Policy at their meeting in October 2014 along with a list of associated actions.

This report provides a summary of the work undertaken in the last two years to improve fire management measures across the Shire of Jerramungup and then goes on to review the Local Planning Policy and Council resolution from October 2014.

# **BACKGROUND**

# **Previous considerations**

Following a serious bushfire to the north of the Bremer Bay townsite in December 2012 Council embarked on a series of improvements to the fire management of the whole Shire and in particular the Point Henry peninsula.

In February 2013 Council considered the engagement of a consultant to prepare a Fire Management Strategy for Point Henry.

Geoffrey Lush from TME Town Planning, Management, Engineering Pty Ltd (TME) was engaged in April 2013 to prepare the Fire Management Strategy.

A draft Strategy was prepared and considered by Council in December 2013 where it was resolved to adopt the draft Strategy for the purposes of advertising for comment.

Council then considered the Point Henry Fire Management Strategy following advertising at their meeting in October 2014 where it was resolved as follows:

# That Council.

- 1. Adopt the Point Henry Fire Management Strategy Policy Statement found at Attachment C of this report as a Local Planning Policy pursuant to Clause 2.4 of the Shire of Jerramungup Local Planning Scheme No.2 for final approval;
- 2. Retain the draft Point Henry Fire Management Strategy dated January 2014 as a background document to the proposed local planning policy at Attachment C of this report;
- 3. Consider the following changes to the Fire Control Information Notice:
  - Amend how rural residential areas are referred to by differentiating between Point Henry and other Rural Residential areas;
  - Phase in over a five year period requirements for compliant access, turnarounds for heavy firefighting vehicles, dedicated water source and a 20m Building Protection Zone in accordance with the Point Henry Fire Management Strategy Policy Statement found at Attachment C; and
  - Allow for extended approvals for variations issued under the Fire Control Information Notice.
- 4. Investigate implementing a reflector system that indicates a property's fire management measures in conjunction with the local volunteer bushfire brigade and DFES;
- 5. Forward a copy of the Schedule of Submissions at Attachment A to the local volunteer bushfire brigade, LEMC, Bush Fire Advisory Committee, Albany DFES and the Bushfire Ready Group for consideration;
- 6. Investigate and report back to Council what would be required to have a weather station constructed and administered in Bremer Bay;
- 7. Thank those people who took the time to lodge submissions on the draft Point Henry Fire Management Strategy;
- 8. Resolve to use additional funds from the Point Henry Fire Levy to provide rural street numbers to every developed property in Point Henry;
- 9. Encourage the local volunteer bushfire brigade to consider identifying and keeping a register of those properties with a dedicated firefighting water supply greater than 20,000litres;
- 10. Seek management of the Unallocated Crown Land on Torreburrup Hill as a reserve managed by the Shire of Jerramungup;
- 11. Amend the Local Planning Scheme to introduce a general provision relating to bush fire prone land and consider the introduction of a Special Control Area over the Study Area for bushfire management.
- 12. Review Clause 5.25 of the Local Planning Scheme to ensure consistent terminology and to clarify provisions in relation to trees, vegetation and fire management issues.

# Shire-wide Fire Management Measures

Whilst this report largely concerns itself with the Point Henry Rural Residential area it may be informative to briefly describe the fire management measures being undertaken by the Shire of Jerramungup since December 2012.

Fire Management may be generally split into three separate parts:

# 1. Response & Recovery

Responding to and recovering from bushfire emergency is the responsibility of the local government, volunteer brigades and the emergency services agencies depending upon the nature of the event. The Shire of Jerramungup has a role in resourcing, planning, coordinating and preparing for disasters including fire events.

# 2. Prevention & Mitigation – public land;

The aim of mitigation works is to reduce the likelihood and severity of a bushfire. Reducing the potential impacts upon assets, people and property is a shared responsibility between government agencies and private landholders and other users. The approach to mitigation needs to be strategic and coordinated in nature, to effectively utilise the limited resources available to the Shire of Jerramungup and the State.

The Shire of Jerramungup has been declared a bushfire prone area by the State Emergency Management Committee (SEMC) as such we are now required under Wesplan fire to develop a Bushfire Risk Management Plan (BRMP).

In late 2015 the Shire of Jerramungup was successful in obtaining funding to develop a BRMP, using a Department of Emergency Services (DFES) and Office of Bushfire Risk Management (OBRM) developed system and supporting software. This project is well progressed.

# 3. <u>Prevention & Mitigation – privately owned land (development control/land use planning).</u>

The planning and building legislation has recently been updated to raise the importance of bushfire management to the highest level. Bushfire management now needs to be considered at every stage of the planning process from Local Planning Strategies right through to development applications. This is achieved through the application of a bushfire policy framework that includes State Planning Policy 3.7, associated Guidelines and changes to the planning and building Regulations.

The Shire is working toward making the whole shire a safer place through the <u>consistent</u> application of policies. A brief summary of achievements in the last two years include:

- Adoption and implementation of the site specific Point Henry Management Strategy;
- Roads within the Point Henry Peninsula have been upgraded and roadside vegetation slashed to assist in suppression and fire control activities;
- A study is currently underway to map and understand the vegetation communities
  present in Point Henry and surrounding reserves and come up with best practice
  mitigation methods and recommendations for land managers and private
  landowners;
- BAL Contour planning has been developed for our town sites to assist individual landowners and inform townsite mitigation planning;
- A Shire-wide Bushfire Risk Management Plan has been substantially completed which is funded by DFES. Two officers have been employed to prepare this plan and provide considerable professional advice on Shire fire management issues; adopting a tenure blind approach to fire mitigation and preparedness.
- A new water bombing facility is being developed at Bremer Bay Airfield with a 110Kl tank and support building established at a new aeroplane turnaround.

Grant applications to establish aircraft turnaround and cross runway have been lodged.

- We have trained and had a key staff member accredited in the Bushfire Attack Level Assessor Course.
- The Shire has engaged consultants to prepare a visual guide for vegetation in the Shire of Jerramungup to assist people in managing the risk to their properties and interpreting AS3959.
- The Shire in partnership with DFES and the Shire of Ravensthorpe employs a Community Emergency Services Officer to provide support to our community and volunteer brigades to plan and prepare for fire events.
- The Shire actively engages with volunteers and agencies to review and maintain response and recovery planning.
- The Shire has adopted an innovative reflector system to inform volunteer fire fighters of properties that have a compliant driveway, turnaround, water source and asset protection zone in an emergency.

As can be seen the Shire has committed a great deal of officer time and resources to fire management in recent years, a more thorough summary of the various fire management measures conducted throughout the Shire of Jerramungup and in particular Point Henry and surrounds since December 2012 is attached to this report at **Attachment 10.3.1(a).** 

It should be noted there are many parties involved in fire management across the shire including state government agencies, local government, volunteers and the general community. Fire prevention and management is a 'shared responsibility' and this a summary of the local government involvement only.

# **Bushfire Policy Framework**

In December 2015 the state government released a suite of reforms in response to the Keelty Report 2011 that apply across the state and elevate bush fire issues to the highest level of planning policy.

The Department of Fire and Emergency Services (DFES), Building Commission and Western Australian Planning Commission (WAPC) collectively released:

- State Planning Policy 3.7 'Planning in Bushfire Prone Areas';
- Amendments to Planning Regulations;
- Amendments to Building Regulations;
- An order by the Fire & Emergency Services Commissioner designating bushfire prone areas;
- Published the Map of Bushfire Prone areas; and
- Published the Guidelines for Planning in Bushfire Prone Areas

These changes have resulted in alterations to the planning approval process for all properties identified as 'bushfire prone'. *Essentially* as it applies to development proposals, this policy framework:

- i) Identifies and declares areas within 100m of bushland as 'bushfire prone'; and
- ii) Requires that new development within an area declared bushfire prone engage a professional to:

- Prepare an assessment of the bushfire risk to the building (BAL Assessment);
- Propose how the development will comply with the new State Planning Policy 3.7 and associated Guidelines by providing a Bushfire Management Plan; and
- Establish the construction standard for the new building in accordance with Australian Standard 3959 (AS3959) Construction of Buildings in Bushfire Prone Areas.

This supersedes some of the requirements of the Council's adopted Local Planning Policy 18.

# **CONSULTATION**

Should Council agree to review Local Planning Policy 18 it will be advertised for at least 21 days for public comment before being brought back to Council for a final decision.

# **COMMENT**

Local Planning Policy 18 - Point Henry Fire Management Strategy Policy Statement (LPP18) currently consists of aims, background, definitions, provisions and an implementation section. It also references and includes the 'strategy plan'. As a local planning policy it goes further than stipulating development control measures and includes a number of mitigation proposals and further actions.

LPP18 is proposed for review in light of the following:

- State adoption of Bushfire Policy Framework including SPP3.7, Guidelines and Regulations;
- It recognises that a number of required actions have been completed;
- Knowledge gained through recent minor fire events on Point Henry; and
- The Bushfire Risk Management Plan (BRMP) process and the results of staff reviewing the effectiveness of existing measures.

It is proposed to review Local Planning Policy 18 by:

- Removing completed tasks;
- Acknowledging that the new Bushfire Policy Framework supersedes many of the development requirement listed in the current Local Planning Policy;
- That the policy still needs to respond to local conditions including the landscape, topography, vegetation communities and local community issues beyond what the state Bushfire Policy Framework addresses;
- Some previous clauses are best addressed through other fire management mechanisms including the BRMP;
- Adopting a standard Bushfire Management Statement for development in Point Henry rather than requiring a site specific bushfire management plan prepared by an accredited fire professional;
- Adding a new section "Aspirations" to describe the goals for planning in Point Henry; and

 Reviewing the function and number of strategic fire breaks in Point Henry and proposing the removal of a number of breaks in order to use resources more effectively and efficiently.

A full review of each clause and an associated recommendation is provided at **Attachment 10.3.1(b)**.

# Main Issues

There are two major changes proposed in the review that require further discussion; strategic fire breaks and the adoption of a Bushfire Management Statement.

# Review of strategic fire breaks

A strategic break network has been established over time throughout Point Henry, these were initially put in as low fuel areas to slow the spread of fire. These breaks were required as each subdivision progressed over time. They were then intended to be maintained by any landowner who had a break on their property, in lieu of individual fire breaks.

As a result of a review of fire protection measures in Point Henry conducted in 2008 the Shire worked to reach formal agreement with individual landowners to allow the Shire access to their properties so that the Shire could maintain the breaks.

The original intention of the breaks was to slow the spread of fire, as a place from which to conduct back burning or defensive actions and potentially as a secondary escape route for residents in dire need.

# Review of Strategic Break network

Now that the BRMP staff, ranger and the planning officer have reviewed their condition and role a new approach is advocated because of the following issues:

- Many breaks are too rough and inaccessible to put a 4WD fire truck down let alone individual people in 2WD seeking to escape their home in an emergency;
- b) Due to the need to screen them from the surrounding road network (because of trespass issues arising) some do not connect to the surrounding road network or worse are open only at one end.
- c) The local brigade is unaware of either their existence or their condition leading to them not being utilised;
- d) A number of the strategic breaks are not trafficable and are not considered to be a practical place from which to undertake defensive actions; and
- e) Fire calculations against the vegetation types show that a 20m wide low fuel area in this landscape will hardly slow a fire at all. For example, using an average summer day in Bremer Bay and using the flame length calculations from AS3959:
  - Peppermint Woodland on a moderate slope (5 degrees) has a flame length of 13.4m
  - Health land on a moderate slope (5 degrees) has a flame length of ~9m.

• When you factor in the fire intensity and radiant heat; 20m of low fuel area will not slow a fire for any meaningful length of time in an open landscape; particularly one as hilly and windblown as Point Henry.

Therefore if the strategic break network is to perform a meaningful role it needs to act more as an 'emergency access way'. An emergency access way is defined in the Guidelines as:

An emergency access way is to meet all of the following requirements:

- Requirements in Table 4, Column 4;
- No further than 600 metres from a public road;
- Provided as right of way or public access easement in gross to ensure accessibility to the public and fire services during an emergency; and
- Must be signposted.

An extract of the relevant standards from Table 4, column 4 states:

Technical Requirements	Emergency Access Way
Minimum trafficable surface (m)	6
Horizontal clearance (m)	6
Vertical clearance (m)	4.5
Maximum grade <50 metres	1 in 10
Maximum cross fall	1 in 33
Curves minimum inner radius (m)	8.5

A modified, tailored standard is proposed acknowledging the existing circumstances and limited available resources to ensure a practical, minimum standard. It is proposed to upgrade the retained strategic breaks and convert them to emergency access ways as follows:

- Retain the 20m width low fuel area;
- Stabilise a central running track to accommodate 4WD fire fighting vehicles only;
- Install identifying signage so emergency services can orientate themselves quickly in an emergency; and
- Install Interpretive signage to deter public access.

A review of the existing Strategic Break network for Point Henry has been conducted with a view to ensuring that all breaks are:

- Able to perform (or have the ability to be upgraded) as a modified emergency access way;
- Are strategic in nature and cannot be replaced by an existing road; and
- Work to break Point Henry into management cells.

Ideally the remaining unnecessary breaks would be decommissioned in order to allow the resources used for their maintenance to be better used on more meaningful mitigation measures on Point Henry.

The Point Henry Fire Strategy Plan shows the breaks to be retained and those to be removed. An Emergency Access Way as it applies to Point Henry is defined in the revised Local Planning Policy 18.

The benefits of this approach include:

- All access ways would be accessible, clearly identified and the local brigade would know that they are safe to traverse; and
- Resources would be focussed on more meaningful strategic mitigation measures.

# Issues:

However there are issues to consider if the strategic break network is to be revised:

- Many landowners in Point Henry have developed with the belief that the breaks will assist in the protection of their home. The most effective mitigation measures that an individual landowner can employ are now mandated through the Fire Control Information Notice (ie APZ, access, turnaround and water available), plus recommendations to be circulated soon about how to effectively manage fuel loads on the balance of their property away from the house.
- The breaks will perform a slightly different role than previously and may need to be improved to make them more trafficable. Some landowners may resist the idea with thought of the changes encouraging more trespassing as the access ways would be more visible. Keeping entries low key and creating a trafficable track that is suitable for 4WD access only, erecting warning/interpretive signage and some active policing may assist in this matter.
- The Shire has entered into agreements with each landowner with a current strategic break running through their property. These either need to be removed (with the landowners consent and at some cost) or a separate arrangement made where the agreement is retained for the current owner only but a written acceptance that the break will not be maintained is reached.
- There will be costs in progressively upgrading these breaks to access way status
  including some stabilisation of a central running track and installation of gated
  entryways. These costs should be offset by the decommissioning excess breaks
  from the network.

# Bushfire Management Statement

The 'Guidelines for Planning in Bushfire Prone Areas' state that development applications for housing in bushfire prone areas should include the following information:

- "A BAL Contour Map or BAL Assessment;
- The identification of any issues arising from the BAL Contour Map or BAL Assessment;
- An assessment against the bushfire protection criteria contained within these Guidelines demonstrating compliance within the boundary of the development application."

Appendix four of these Guidelines list four elements which development must comply:

- Location, Siting & Design of Development, Vehicular Access and Water.
- Each of these elements is broken down into 'performance principle' and 'acceptable solutions'; if the development application can meet each of the relevant 'acceptable solutions' then approval is granted.
- Importantly, if one of the relevant 'acceptable solutions' cannot be complied with then assessment of an alternative approach is required and it is to be assessed against the "performance principles". Where this happens the Guidelines strongly

- recommended that a full Bushfire Management Plan is prepared by a level 2 or 3 accredited Bushfire professional.
- The expected standard for residential development in Point Henry has been set through LPP18, the updated Fire Control Information Notice and now the new Guidelines. Rather than have an accredited fire professional prepare a site specific bushfire management in every instance, it is recommended that as "Bushfire Management Statement" be included in LPP18 that clearly sets out the Council's expectations. Failure to meet these requirements, leads to a proponent having to engage an accredited fire professional and prepare a full Bushfire Management Plan.

A template is included as appendix 1 of the revised draft LPP18 at **Attachment 10.3.1(c)**.

# Information Pack

When all the various fire management and other Scheme provisions are listed it is acknowledged that developing in Point Henry could start to look quite daunting. An information pack summarising the main requirements for new development has been prepared and is at **Attachment 10.3.1(d)** of this report.

# Conclusion

The Shire of Jerramungup has undertaken a great deal of work in the fire management area in the last two years; following through on the Council's resolutions from October 2014, successfully starting a BRMP for the whole Shire and making improvements around the brigade practices and supporting infrastructure.

Given this work and the fact that the state government has now released a Bushfire Policy Framework it is time to review Local Planning Policy 18 and the actions that contribute to its successful implementation in order to continue to improve the fire management outcomes for Point Henry.

This report recommends a review of LPP18 and other fire management recommendations for Point Henry with the following major changes:

- Update LPP18 to accommodate the state's Bushfire Policy Framework;
- Add a Bushfire Management Statement to LPP18 to add clarity to Council's requirements for new development in Point Henry;
- Add a section on 'aspirations for Point Henry fire management' to clearly annunciate what we are aiming to achieve in the long run and to focus all clauses and controls.
- Revise the existing strategic fire break network to ensure that they are safe, effective and meaningful with the benefit of maximising the use of the Point Henry Fire Levy;
- Release an information pack for Developing in Point Henry;
- Prepare a visual guide for vegetation types in the Shire of Jerramungup as they relate to AS3959;
- Prepare a Vegetation Management Plan for Point Henry that maps the vegetation communities and provides recommendations on weed control and fire management measures for specific vegetation communities with a view to retaining their ecological values over time and ensuring appropriate management

- of fuel loads on the balance of Title (i.e. the part of the property not immediately associated with the development on the property).
- The Council consider preparing an Asset Plan updated annually that documents all development with the status of the fire management elements available at each property.
- Connect the northern and southern portions of Wellstead Road with a suitable trafficable link.
- Adopt a standard for variations to the Fire Control Information Notice as they apply to Point Henry.
- Adopt a specification for roadside slashing that slashes around green domes, avoids areas of Kwongkan Shrubland where practical and addresses weed infestations appropriately.

# STATUTORY REQUIREMENTS

# Fire management

The Department of Planning have prepared a suite of information sheets, the sheet *'Information for Local Governments'* summarises the statutory situation as follows:

Areas within Western Australia have now been designated as bushfire prone by the FES Commissioner. This order was gazetted in tandem with the Planning and Development (Local Planning Scheme) Amendment Regulations 2015 and new State Planning Policy 3.7: Planning in Bushfire Prone Areas (SPP 3.7) which together form the State Government's bushfire planning reforms.

The Map of Bush Fire Prone Areas identify the parts of the State that are designated as bushfire prone and come into effect on 8 December 2015.

The Planning and Development (Local Planning Scheme) Amendment Regulations 2015 (LPS Amendment Regulations 2015) introduce deemed provisions relating to bushfire at Part 10A and came into effect on 8 December 2015. Due to the transitional arrangements provided by the LPS Amendment Regulations 2015, some provisions will not become operational until 8 April 2016.

SPP 3.7 and the Guidelines for Planning in Bushfire Prone Areas were released and took effect on the 7 December 2015. SPP 3.7 provides the foundation for land use planning decisions in designated bushfire prone areas and local governments need to give due regard to the policy provisions.

# **Policies**

Local Planning Policy procedure is now addressed by the 'Deemed Provisions' of the Planning and Development (Local Planning Schemes) Regulations 2015. Clause 5 of the Deemed Provisions establishes the procedure of amending local planning policies. It requires an amended policy to be advertised for 21 days.

Council is then required to consider any submissions received from the advertising of the draft policy and resolve to modify or not proceed with the policy.

# STRATEGIC IMPLICATIONS

This item relates to the following component from the Shire of Jerramungup Community Plan 2016 - 2026;

**Aspiration 1.2 - Environmental Planning and Restoration** To facilitate community programs and initiatives that deliver best practice environmental planning, management and mitigate the impacts of climate change.

In particular **Objective 1.2.4** - Ensure that new development is well designed and sustainable, where community needs are met while conserving our natural and built environment.

**Aspiration 2.4 - Emergency Management** To ensure that the Shire of Jerramungup is seen as an industry leader in emergency management and preparedness.

# **FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS**

Much of the anticipated expenditure in the planning for fire management in Point Henry has already been secured through Council's 2016/17 budget and successful grant applications.

Changes to the strategic break network would allow the Point Henry fire levy to be used on higher priority mitigation.

# RECOMMENDATION

That Council,

- Amend Local Planning Policy No.18 Point Henry Fire Management Strategy in accordance with the recommendations at Attachment B and as per the draft policy at Attachment C of this report.
- 2. Advertise the amended Local Planning Policy in accordance with Clause 5 of Schedule 2 of the Planning and Development (Local Planning Schemes) Regulations 2015 by writing to all landowners on Point Henry and publishing a notice of the amended policy once a week for two consecutive weeks in a newspaper circulating in the area, giving details of:

- a) Where the draft policy may be inspected;
- b) The subject and nature of the Policy; and

#### **SUMMARY**

The state government adopted a new Bushfire Policy Framework that applies to all new development in areas declared bushfire prone from April 2016.

Essentially this framework as it applies to residential development in townsites:

- i) Identifies and declares areas within 100m of bushland as 'bushfire prone'; and
- ii) Requires that new residential development within an area declared bushfire prone engage a professional to:
  - Prepare an assessment of the bushfire risk to the building (BAL Assessment);and
  - Establish the construction standard for the new building in accordance with Australian Standard 3959 (AS3959) Construction of Buildings in Bushfire Prone Areas.

This report recommends adopting a draft local planning policy <u>as it applies to Jerramungup and Bremer Bay</u> townsites that:

- Recognises the requirements of the new Bushfire Policy Framework;
- Acknowledges the cost and difficulty in getting fire professionals to come to the Shire of Jerramungup; and
- Adopts a BAL Contour Plan for the Jerramungup and Bremer Bay townsites that assigns a BAL rating to a property (rather than the landowner engaging a professional)

#### **BACKGROUND**

Large areas of the Shire of Jerramungup are prone to bushfires due to topography, vegetation and climate. In 2015 the state government released a suite of reforms in response to the Keelty Report 2011 that apply across the state and elevate bush fire issues to the highest level of planning policy.

The Department of Fire and Emergency Services (DFES), Building Commission and Western Australian Planning Commission (WAPC) collectively released:

- State Planning Policy 3.7 'Planning in Bushfire Prone Areas';
- Amendments to Planning Regulations;
- Amendments to Building Regulations;
- An order by the Fire & Emergency Services Commissioner designating bushfire prone areas;
- Published the Map of Bushfire Prone areas; and
- Published the Guidelines for Planning in Bushfire Prone Areas

#### Development Assessment process

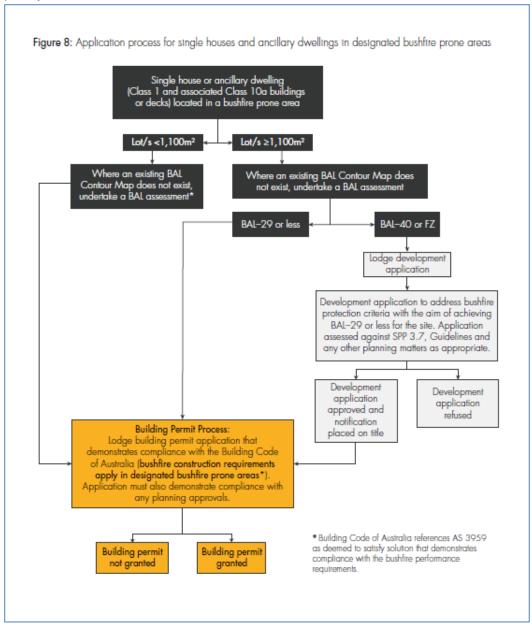
The Bushfire Policy Framework effectively raises this importance of fire management in the planning and building assessment process to the highest level of consideration. Fire Management must be considered at every level of planning from Local Planning Strategies through to development applications.

When assessing a development application the first step is to ascertain if the property has been declared bushfire prone by the DFES Commissioner through the 'Map of Bushfire Prone Areas'. The Map of Bush Fire Prone Areas provides a single means of identifying whether a site is designated under law as being bushfire prone at the state level.



Extract of Map of Bush Fire Prone Areas

Identification as bushfire prone triggers the assessment requirements of the bushfire policy framework as follows:



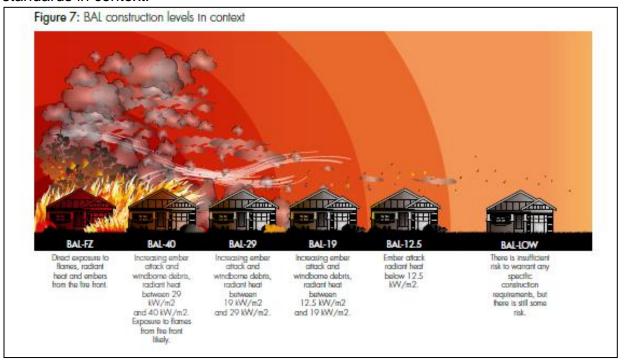
Extract from Guidelines for Planning in Bushfire Prone Areas

The intention of the policy framework is to "implement effective, risk-based land use planning and development to preserve life and reduce the impact of bushfire on property and infrastructure."

The assessment measure used in determining bushfire threat to a building is the Bushfire Attack Level (BAL) which is based on the heat flux exposure thresholds. The BAL levels range from:

- BAL LOW where the risk to considered to be very low and there is insufficient risk to warrant any specific construction requirements but there is still some risk; to
- BAL-Flame Zone (Fz) where the risk is considered to be extreme. There is an extremely high risk of ember attack, burning debris, radiant heat and direct flame contact with the building.

In regard to residential development applications the intention is to ensure that all development is BAL29 or less. The image below explains the BAL construction standards in context.



#### **BAL Contour Plan**

A BAL Contour Plan is described as follows:

#### "What is a Bushfire Attack Level (BAL) Contour Map?

A Bushfire Attack Level (BAL) Contour Map is a scale map of a development site, including the proposed lot layout, which shows indicative BAL ratings across the site and within the immediate surrounding area.

.... A BAL Contour Map is also used for planning and building purposes to determine whether a building or development requires additional measures to manage the threat of bushfire.

A BAL Contour Map can be prepared by an accredited Level 2 or Level 3 Bushfire Planning Practitioner.

If you are proposing to build or develop in a designated bushfire prone area you may be able to use a BAL Contour Map in place of a BAL assessment. Where a BAL Contour Map and accompanying compliance certificate/report exist for your property, you can obtain a copy from the developer of the subdivision or a previous owner."

An information pack on BAL Contour Plans is provided at **Attachment 10.3.2(c)**.

#### **CONSULTATION**

If LPP22 is adopted as a draft policy it will be advertised for public comment for as minimum of 21 days.

Early discussions with the bushfire officers at the Department of Planning gained support for the concept but they qualified this by requiring that any draft policy be referred to both Department of Planning and Department of Fire and Emergency during the public advertising period.

#### COMMENT

The townsites within the Shire of Jerramungup reasonably small in scale and have a number of undeveloped or 'under-developed' sites. The townsites are well established with the majority of remnant vegetation being located within reserve systems.

The recent release of the Bushfire Prone Mapping and the WAPC Bushfire Policy framework has increased the level of complexity when lodging development applications. The majority of landowners and developers are 'owner builders' or reasonably unfamiliar with the development process and requirements.

Additionally, the townsites are remote to professional services, any service usually comes with considerable travel costs added.

Large areas of the townsites are required to prepare a BAL Assessment being identified as 'bushfire prone' by the recently released State-wide Bushfire Prone mapping.

State Planning Policy 3.7 (SPP3.7) allows for the preparation of BAL Contour Maps where land has a Bushfire Hazard Level above Low. Clause 6.5 of SPP3.7 lists the information required to be lodged with a development proposal, part a (ii) includes a BAL Contour Map that has been prepared for an approved subdivision clearly showing the indicative acceptable BAL rating across the subject site....

In this case it is proposed to adopt a BAL Contour Plan over the Jerramungup and Bremer Bay town sites and effectively treat the townsites as a 'subdivision'. It is a reasonably innovative idea proposed with the intention of:

- Prepare a BAL Contour Map for each major townsite in the Shire of Jerramungup in order to inform landowners of the applicable BAL rating that applies to their property and inform the assessment process by the local government;
- Achieve a consistent application of AS3959 across the townsites;
- Save costs, time and reduce the complexity of development applications in recognition of the need to support and encourage development in the Shire's townsites:
- Use the BAL Contour Map as an education tool in bushfire awareness and inform landowners of the development expectations early in the development process; and

• Inform the townsite mitigation planning by highlighting areas with high BAL ratings.

#### Draft Policy

Draft Local Planning Policy 22 - BAL Contour Plan for Jerramungup & Bremer Bay basically proposes to:

- 1. Assign a BAL rating to each property capable of residential development in Jerramungup and Bremer Bay townsites;
- 2. Offer the landowner the choice of accepting the BAL Contour Plan BAL rating or allow them to have their own BAL Assessment prepared by an accredited fire consultant; and
- 3. Confirm that all residential development in the townsite should make every effort to achieve a maximum BAL rating of BAL29. The policy offers recommendations where development on the property cannot practically achieve BAL29 because of bushland beyond the landowners control such as reserve land.

A copy of the draft policy is found at **Attachment 10.3.2(b)** of this report.

#### BAL Contour Plan

The policy simply references the report the Shire has had prepared by Bio-Diverse Solutions, found at **Attachment 10.3.2(a)**. This report includes plans that apply a BAL rating to all properties capable of residential development. It classifies the vegetation, assesses the slope of land immediately around the townsites, discusses the potential fire impacts and the assumptions around the report and assigns a BAL rating.

The information is available in the report, in a JPEG image or as shape file for use in a GIS system. An example of a BAL Contour Plan as it applies to a specific property is shown over leaf.



#### Landowner choice

There may be circumstances where a landowner refuses to accept the recommended BAL rating for their property. In this instance it is fair to allow another BAL assessment of the proposed development. However, as the BAL Contour Plan has been prepared by an accredited person, the new BAL Assessment should be prepared by an accredited fire consultant also.

#### BAL29 Maximum

SPP3.7 and the associated Guidelines are drafted to try to make sure that all residential development achieves a maximum BAL rating of BAL 29. Where a property has a BAL rating of BAL 40 or Fz a planning application is required that must show how the Guidelines have been addressed including reducing the BAL to BAL 29.

There are a number of sites around the townsites where it is not possible to reduce the BAL to BAL29. These sites include properties that front reserve land or where the neighbouring property has certifiable vegetation. An example is shown overleaf.

Where this situation arises the applicant should make every attempt to work with their neighbours to manage the adjacent vegetation. Where it is reserve land managed by the Shire of Jerramungup the Shire becomes the neighbour.

A number of circumstances have been identified already where the Shire does not have any plans to manage the vegetation along the boundary of an existing residential property. Therefore development of the property adjacent to the reserve

has no alternative than to build to BAL40 or BALFz; contrary to the intention of the Bushfire Policy Framework and at great additional cost to the landowner.

This policy recommends allowing that landowner to apply to Council for a licence to manage a portion of the adjoining reserve in perpetuity. This would be to a standard and width that meets the requirements to drop the BAL to BAL29. It would only be offered where there was *no practical alternative* and it was deemed environmentally appropriate.



An example of properties in Bremer Bay with 75% of the property either BAL40 or Fz because of vegetation in neighbouring reserve.

#### Conclusion

The Bushfire Policy Framework, when applied with discretion, is a satisfactory planning tool for reducing the impact of bushfire on life, property and infrastructure. However, there are issues with the policy framework as it is applied in the Shire of Jerramungup with additional requirements resulting in higher costs and increased assessment times, plus issues with access to appropriately qualified consultants.

This policy seeks to apply a prepared BAL Contour Plan to the townsites of Jerramungup and Bremer Bay in order to assist in streamlining the development process and get a more consistent result to bushfire management.

This approach is an alternative way of using BAL Contour Plans that than anticipated by the WAPC when they prepared their policy framework but it has received qualified support from the Department of Planning staff.

#### STRATEGIC IMPLICATIONS

This item relates to the following component from the Shire of Jerramungup Community Plan 2016 - 2026;

**Aspiration 1.2 - Environmental Planning and Restoration** To facilitate community programs and initiatives that deliver best practice environmental planning, management and mitigate the impacts of climate change.

In particular objective **1.2.4** - Ensure that new development is well designed and sustainable, where community needs are met while conserving our natural and built environment.

**Aspiration 2.4 - Emergency Management** To ensure that the Shire of Jerramungup is seen as an industry leader in emergency management and preparedness.

#### **STATUTORY REQUIREMENTS**

The Department of Planning have prepared a suite of information sheets, the sheet *'Information for Local Governments'* summarises the statutory situation as follows:

Areas within Western Australia have now been designated as bushfire prone by the FES Commissioner. This order was gazetted in tandem with the Planning and Development (Local Planning Scheme) Amendment Regulations 2015 and new State Planning Policy 3.7: Planning in Bushfire Prone Areas (SPP 3.7) which together form the State Government's bushfire planning reforms.

The Map of Bush Fire Prone Areas identify the parts of the State that are designated as bushfire prone and come into effect on 8 December 2015.

The Planning and Development (Local Planning Scheme) Amendment Regulations 2015 (LPS Amendment Regulations 2015) introduce deemed provisions relating to bushfire at Part 10A and came into effect on 8 December 2015. Due to the transitional arrangements provided by the LPS Amendment Regulations 2015, some provisions will not become operational until 8 April 2016.

SPP 3.7 and the Guidelines for Planning in Bushfire Prone Areas were released and took effect on the 7 December 2015. SPP 3.7 provides the foundation for land use planning decisions in designated bushfire prone areas and local governments need to give due regard to the policy provisions.

#### FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

There will a cost in keeping the BAL Contour Mapping up to date, with a review undertaken annually by staff in consultation with the local brigades to determine what mitigation has been undertaken over the last year. The plans would then require updating to remain current.

There will be savings for landowners as they will not have to engage fire professionals to prepare BAL Assessments within townsites.

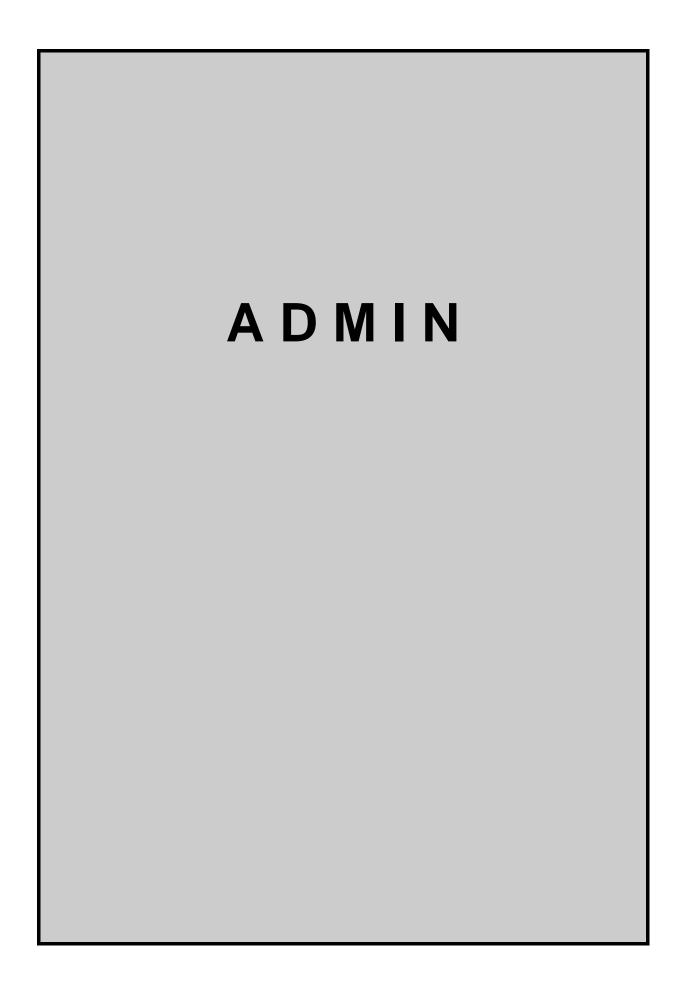
