


# RISK MANAGEMENT PLAN

# Beasts, Bombs & Beauties: Bremer Bay Car Show

Saturday 20<sup>th</sup> January 2024 9.30am-3:00pm: Car Show & Market Day 5.30pm: Award Presentation & Dinner

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### 1.1 Introduction

The Bremer Bay Progress Association INC is excited to bring the inaugural *Bombs*, *Beasts and Beauties: Bremer Bay Car Show* to locals and visitors on Saturday 20<sup>th</sup> January 2024 at the Bremer Bay Sports Club. The event will consist of a Car Show with Market stalls, food and entertainment on the Bremer Bay Sports Club Oval from 10am to 3pm, followed by an Award Presentation Ceremony and Dinner at the Sports Club from 5:30pm.

### 1.2 Background of event

The Bremer Bay Progress Association INC was formed in May 2023 by local citizens with a passion for our beautiful town. Our vision is to create, promote and sustain Bremer Bay as a progressive town that is welcoming, clean, safe and respectful of locals, visitors and our unique natural environment.

During 2023 the Bremer Bay Progress Association has been working closely with the Shire of Jerramungup, the local community and other stakeholders to advocate for the betterment of our town. As part of this process a fundraising subcommittee within the Bremer Bay Progress Association was set up to obtain funds for potential projects to improve facilities and benefit the people of Bremer Bay.

Noting the number of car enthusiasts in Bremer Bay and the surrounding areas it was proposed to hold a Bremer Bay Car Show, like other Show & Shine events held across Western Australia. We are now in the final stages of bringing this new and exciting event to Bremer Bay which we are sure will be well attended by the local community and visitors alike.

### 1.3 Details of the event

Bombs, Beasts & Beauties is set to bring an exciting new event to Bremer Bay for visitors and locals alike. This will be a Car Show with a twist featuring people's choice awards for the best bomb, beast, or beauty, as well as Australian or International cars from both pre and post 1980. This fun event will include market stalls, our local Emergency Services will be on display to show case the amazing work they do, plus there will be live music, food, and free kids Entertainment. Afterwards, drinks and dinner along with award presentations will take place at the Sports Club from 5:30pm.

As this event will fall during the January School Holidays, we are anticipating an attendance of approximately 2000 people during the day and approximately 300 people in the evening. The event will be an "accessible event", meaning the location is equipped to welcome people with disabilities.

The entrance fees for this event will be \$5 for adults and gold coin donation for Seniors and Under 16s with the event open to all locals and visitors in Bremer Bay and the wider community.

### 1.4 Event area

The event location will be the Bremer Bay Sports Club Oval on Frantom Way for the Car Show portion of the event and the Bremer Bay Sports Club building for the evening portion.

Local emergency services will be set up and on display in the centre of the Bremer Bay Sports Club Oval. This includes the Volunteer Marine Rescue, St John WA Jerramungup Subcentre volunteers with the Bremer Bay ambulance, Volunteer Fire & Emergency Services Bremer Bay Brigade including the Road Crash Rescue team and the Jerramungup Police.

Car Show entrants will have the option to participate in a poker run/car convoy from Boxwood Hill to Bremer Bay on the morning of the show. Those car entrants not participating in the will be required to be parked in their allocated numbered car bay prior to the Car Show opening at 9:30am. Once all market stallholders and car entrants are in place there will be no further movement apart from the arrival of the convoy below until the Car Show event closes at 3:30pm.

Those participating in the car convoy will depart from Boxwood Hill and will travel with Jerramungup Police escort along the Borden-Bremer Bay Road into town. Once they enter Bremer Bay, the convoy will follow the route below to travel through town to the Bremer Bay Sports Club oval. Temporary fencing/bunting will be utilised on the oval to ensure the safe movement of vehicles onto and offsite.





### **Proposed Car Convoy Route**

Escorted by Jerramungup Police car owners participating in the Poker Run will depart from Boxwood Hill at 9am and travel to Bremer Bay.

On arrival in Bremer Bay it is proposed that the convoy will in the following manner:

Seadragon Ave to Mary Street Mary Street to Bennett Street Bennett Street to Bremer Bay Road

Bremer Bay Road to Bremer Caravan Park Through Bremer Bay Caravan Park and back onto Bremer Bay Road

Bremer Bay Road to Frantom Way Down Frantom Way onto the Sports Club Oval

We are in the process of obtaining a traffic management plan from accredited traffic management company, *Traffic Force* to assist the Bremer Bay Progress Association INC deal with the risks associated with vehicle movement as part of this event.

We anticipate this will include closing Frantom Way to all non-event traffic. Exceptions to this will be made for accredited ACROD parking holders, event bus, market vendors, car show entrants and Bremer Bay Sports Club members.

Patrons attending the event will be encouraged to walk where possible. However, to assist with the movement of patrons to the event site we have engaged the services of local school bus run owner Kempley Brooks. There will be pick up/drop off points both in town and at Point Henry as per the map below ferrying people back and forth throughout the day.








Bremer Bay Beaches Caravan Park

### 1.6 Entertainment

### Car Show 9:30am-3:30pm

During the Car Show portion of the event, Rob Wessling will be providing DJ services using his own music and PA equipment which Bremer Bay Progress Association INC will also use to perform master of ceremonies functions throughout the day. In addition, local musician Tanya Buckenara has been engaged for live acoustic performances.

There will be a variety of market stall holders available on the day in addition to food vendors. There will be a sand pit with toys for children to play in along with face painting and a bouncy castle for children's entertainment.

In addition, event patrons will be able to view and vote on their favourite beast, bomb or beauty of a car.

### **Award Presentation 5:30pm**

Commencing at 5:30pm, the Bremer Bay Sports Club will be open for drinks and dinner with the Car Show Award Presentation and Silent Auction occurring. Performer Hayden McGlinn will also be providing a live acoustic musical performance between 5.30-9.30pm followed by DJ Robbo to close.

### 1.7 Catering

We will have the following catering options set up on the oval during the Car Show portion of the event.

- St John WA -Jerramungup Subbranch: Sausage Sizzle
- Local Native Food Van: Burgers/Tacos etc...
- Orcas Coffee Company: Coffee Van & Ice cream

The Bremer Bay Community Men's Shed will have container deposit collection stations set up on the oval to collect any eligible cans.

For the Award Presentation in the evening at the Sports Club we will have the following options.

- Bremer Bay Progress Association: Roast Meat & Gravy Rolls
- Local Native Food Van: Burgers/Tacos etc...

Both Orcas Coffee Company and the Local Native Food Van are registered food businesses operating in the Shire of Jerramungup. St John Ambulance and Bremer Bay Progress Association are community organisations undertaking catering opportunities for fundraising purposes and as such will be seeking approval from the Shire of Jerramungup to operate.

## HEALTH, SAFETY AND AMENITY OF THE PUBLIC

### 3.1 Security

Decisions on the provision of crowd control services have been made by recommendations of the Jerramungup Police. During the Car Show portion of the event Bremer Bay Progress Association volunteers and local Police will be on site to assist with any potential issues. There will be no alcohol consumption on the oval.

Six security guards will be stationed at the Award Presentation portion of the event taking place at the Bremer Bay Sports Club from 5:30pm until the end of the event. Some of their duties will include general patrolling of the grounds as well as ID checks and control of people consuming alcohol.

### 3.2 Lighting

Being a public space, the entire space has been designed and equipped with sufficient lighting for evening activities. Additional lighting in form of portable lighting towers have been procured.

### 3.3 Car parking

We are engaging the services of an accredited traffic management company to develop a traffic management plan for this event.

Some parking for people with disabilities and the elderly will be available at the Sports Club.

### 3.4 Toilets

On the Bremer Bay Sports Club Oval we will have 8 portable unisex toilets including one disabled toilet provided by Southern Site Hire. Additional toilets in the Bremer Bay Sports Club will be available for use throughout the event. This consists of 3x Female WCs, 2x Male WCs and 3 Male Urinals.

### 3.7 Emergency Services

### **Jerramungup Police**

As per discussion with Jerramungup Police, their crew will assist by providing an escort of vehicles into Bremer Bay to the event location. They will also be stationed on the Sports Club Oval during the day. The Jerramungup Police can back up Rooforce Security Services for crowd control if required.

### **Bremer Bay St. John (Ambulance)**

The Bremer Bay St. John Ambulance volunteers will set up their ambulance at the event location and provide first aid services where required. They will have a backup ambulance on standby for the event, in case required.

### **Bremer Bay Volunteer Emergency Services unit (DFES)**

The Bremer Bay Volunteer Fire and Emergency Services Unit will be on site to assist with any potential fire incidents that may arise during the event. This also gives our local volunteer fire and emergency brigades the opportunity to showcase the fantastic work they do for our local community and potentially obtain additional volunteers.
