Executive Summary

Sport and recreation has always been a significant contributor to enhancing the lifestyle of the Shire of Jerramungup community. Sport and recreation exists in numerous forms however all generally aim to improve the health and wellbeing of participants. This Sport and Recreation Strategy seeks to provide a longer term focus for the improvement of recreation facilities within the Shire. The Shire has worked with the three Sporting Clubs within the Shire of Jerramungup to develop and resource a realistic future scope of works to increase the quality and level of physical activity of residents and visitors.

There are three incorporated sporting clubs in the Shire: Boxwood Hills Combined Sports Club (BHCSC), Bremer Bay Sports Club (BBSC) and Jerramungup Sports Club (JSC). Each sports club have a number of affiliated sporting groups such as hockey, netball, basketball, cricket, football and golf.

The Shire holds the management orders over each of the recreation grounds and performs some limited management and maintenance of infrastructure. Each sporting club is generally self sufficient and performs their own maintenance and management of recreation reserves utilising a mix of volunteers and employed staff. This structure is a testament to the strength of the community and the willingness of volunteers to play an active role in the management and improvement of their individual sports and associated facilities.

The Shire, Department of Sport and Recreation and individual sporting clubs generally partner in the development and upgrading of recreational assets through the Community Sport and Recreation Facilities Fund (CSRFF) funding program.

The Shire of Jerramungup Strategic Community Plan 2012-2025 identifies this plan in Aspiration 5 as requiring regular review to ensure that the Shire and community adequately plan for new infrastructure investment to ensure resident satisfaction with the standard of sport and recreation facilities within the Shire. This plan seeks to provide clear guidance on allocation of resources for the development of recreation assets for the coming 10 years and has been developed in consultation with the local sporting clubs and community.

This strategy seeks to provide the Shire and community with:

- a. Background on local sporting clubs
- b. A future direction and planned approach to the development of sport and recreation in the Shire integrated with the Council 10 Year Financial Plan.
- c. A Council position on financial and in-kind support to facilities on sporting complexes managed by individual Sports Clubs.

Future Development of Sporting Complex Facilities

Major New Assets

- During 2009 the Shire provided each sports club with a business plan template to work towards achieving a strategic 5 year infrastructure plan and encouraged each club to complete analysis in terms of their current and desired position. The following table shows the combined infrastructure requirements as assessed and reviewed by the individual clubs.
- 2. Key funding partners for sporting infrastructure are the Department of Sport and Recreation and Lotterywest. In developing the infrastructure plan the Shire has taken into consideration the criteria for funding under the CSRFF program and also Council's policy to allocate up to 2.5% of previous years rates towards CSRFF projects and community recreation infrastructure.
- 3. In years where the infrastructure pool is oversubscribed, the Shire will prioritise projects in line with the annual CSRFF funding process. Other external funding sources may also be obtained in order to progress projects which are beyond the Shire's financial capacity.
- 4. Since the inception of this Sport and Recreation Facilities Plan in November 2009 the community has successfully completed or received approval the following major projects:
 - a. Upgrade Bremer Bay Sports Club
 - b. Resurface and Upgrade Boxwood Netball and Tennis Courts
 - c. Installation of new field lighting at the Boxwood Hill Sporting Complex
 - d. Refurbishment of ablution facilities at the Jerramungup and Bremer Bay Sports
 - e. Installation of a cricket practice wicket at the Jerramungup Sports Club
- 5. The Bremer Bay Sports Club is currently finalising the project plan and scope for the installation of a synthetic bowling rink.

Guiding Principles and Targets for Infrastructure Investment

Maintain a Realistic Program for Recreation Infrastructure Investment

1. In liaison with the Sports Clubs within the Shire an up to date register of infrastructure projects is to be maintained. This register will satisfy the needs of the Local Recreation Plan and be incorporated into the Shire of Jerramungup 10 Year Financial Plan.

Maintain Criteria for Prioritising Recreational Infrastructure Investment

- 2. During the annual consideration of CSRFF projects the Shire will prioritise each submitted project subject to a number of key criteria as amended by the Department of Sport and Recreation from time to time. At present the criteria is as follows:
 - Project Justification
 - Planned Approach
 - Community Input
 - Management planning
 - Access and Opportunity
 - Design
 - > Financial Viability
 - Coordination
 - Potential to increase physical activity.

Encourage Local Sports Clubs to Remain Autonomous, Vibrant and Involved

3. The current strength and success of the Sporting Clubs within the Shire of Jerramungup is largely attributed to their autonomy and their ability to manage projects on their own behalf. The Shire will seek to encourage this approach to promote strong and vibrant clubs.

Encourage Greater Activity and Utilisation of Recreation Facilities

4. Infrastructure projects will be supported by the Shire where it can be demonstrated that greater participation, increased utilisation of facilities and increased activity levels will result.

Build Strong and Sustainable Sporting Clubs

5. The Shire will encourage and support projects which assist clubs in becoming more sustainable through increased membership, reduced operating costs and are the result of thorough planning. Strategic planning and business planning support is being provided to the Sports Clubs in 2014 and 2015 through the Club Development Officer Program.

Develop Asset Management Plans for Each Sporting Precinct

6. As part of the partnerships between the Shire and local Sporting Clubs the Shire will promote sustainable asset management and develop asset management strategies for the current infrastructure in place at each sporting complex.

Current Facilities Funding Scope

Common Funding / Financial Contributions from Shire of Jerramungup to Sporting Complexes.

- 1) Annual Insurance on buildings and improved infrastructure.
- 2) Occasional inspections of facilities and ovals.
- 3) Occasional supervision by technical staff of infrastructure improvements.
- 4) Occasional assistance from Council plant and machinery for minor works subject to funding approval and compatibility with Council works program.

Bremer Bay Sporting Complex

- 1. The Bremer Bay Sports Club Inc currently funds and manages the operation and maintenance of the Bremer Bay Sports Club and associated sporting facilities.
- 2. The Shire provides occasional financial support subject to budget requests approved by Council.
- 3. Upgrades to facilities are authorised by the Management Committee with building and town planning approvals issued by the Shire where required.

Boxwood Hill Sporting Complex

- 1. The Boxwood Hill Sports Club Inc currently funds and manages the operation and maintenance of the Boxwood Hill Sports Club and associated sporting facilities.
- 2. The Shire of Jerramungup currently contributes 1/3 of the running costs for the Boxwood Hill Hall (up to \$8,000 currently) which is reviewed annually. This contribution reflects the use of the Boxwood Hill Hall as a community meeting facility as provided in the other towns as well as a Sporting Complex. Other financial contributions are subject to funding requests made in time for consideration in Council's annual budget.
- 3. Upgrades to facilities are authorised by the Management Committee with building and town planning approvals issued by the Shire where required.
- 4. The Shire of Jerramungup has in the past assisted with rectifying drainage issues within the carpark to preserve buildings and playing surfaces.
- 5. While not directly associated with the Sports Club the Boxwood Hill Golf Club is in close proximity and completed an upgrade of their clubhouse facilities in 2010 under the CSRFF program.

Jerramungup Sporting Complex

- 1. The Jerramungup Sports Club Inc currently funds and manages the operation and maintenance of the Jerramungup Sports Club and associated sporting facilities.
- 2. The Shire of Jerramungup assumes all costs associated with the Jerramungup Entertainment Centre and charges user fees to clubs and individuals using the facility.
- 3. Upgrades to facilities are authorised by the Management Committee with building and town planning approvals issued by the Shire where required.

4. The Shire of Jerramungup has in the past assisted with rectifying drainage issues within the carpark to preserve buildings and playing surfaces.
