5. MEMBER ITEMS

5.1 Bremer Bay Community Resource Centre and Library

Presented by Terri Smart on behalf of Jen Harland

Please accept my apologies for not attending the meeting.

The Committee is currently feeling much more confident and settled. Fiona Murray has been an incredible help in implementing the restructure.

We are in the process of interviewing candidates for the Manager's position, and we will inform you as soon as someone is appointed.

Additionally, we are advertising for a Customer Service Officer position, 3-4 days per week, as Camila Cordova will be moving on. If you know anyone who might be interested in joining our team, please encourage them to get in touch.

The library is looking great – I've received new books and conducted a clean-out. The books from the clean-out are available in the foyer for sale at \$2 each, and the proceeds are used to purchase specific new titles. This system is working really well. I also have a selection of children's books available for free to any child who visits the library to "read and learn"!

It has been fairly quiet with people which has given us a chance to catch up on things.

Terri added that the library is running very well and Jen has been amazing.

The AGM will be held at the end of October.

The DPIRD requirements of CRCs are rigorous. The CRC was required to restructure and is expected to be financially independent. Two staff are currently employed, the Shire funds one of these. There are concerns that funding from DPIRD will be reduced.

Cr Iffla congratulated the CRC for turning things around and asked that this be passed on to the Committee.

5.2 Fitzgerald Biosphere Group

Caring for Wellstead Estuary Coastal Vegetation

This project is coming to an end. The contractor conducting spraying is nearly done. Signs have been ordered, installation of these will finish the project off.

Strategic Weed Management Project

There has been tremendous involvement from NRM, Weeds Action Group and contractors in protecting priority areas from weeds, mainly aiming at Vic Ti Tree.

Nathan McQuoid led a group of community members with the FBG at the Estuary identifying and discussing management of weeds.

Bird Hide

The Shire has committed \$150,000 towards the Bird Hide. An application will be submitted to Lotterywest for additional funding.

Leonie advised that she is resigning from the FBG, finishing at the end of September. She will, however, see the Bird Hide project through.

Cr Iffla congratulated Leonie on how the Bird Hide project has evolved and the processes followed should be a template on how to get funding and run a project.

Ospreys

General discussion about the Telstra tower and the ospreys. Things have gone quiet. Ospreys will keep nesting in the same location.

There is a community group in Port Lincoln with cameras on an osprey tower. This would be great for the community. Follow Port Lincoln Ospreys on Facebook.

5.3 Bremer Bay Regional Trails Committee

The Trails Committee attempted to hold an AGM, however didn't have a Quorum so couldn't go ahead. The last meeting was held in September 2024. There is diminishing interest and it is hard to keep momentum. Still people passionate but need to get boots on the ground with something to anchor them.

Leonie commented that there is a Trail Development Plan underway from Beaches Caravan Park to Fisheries to Back Beach.

5.4 Bremer Bay Progress Association

Cairn Project

Funding

A Sub-Committee has been established and members are working on grant applications. Funding has been committed from the Men's Shed (\$10,000) and the BBPA (\$10,000).

It was noted that the Shire has not committed funding to the Cairn project in the 2025/2026 Budget. The BBPA had been asked to provide a written request/project plan. As this had not been received, Council has not been in a position to consider the project formally.

Stage 1

Repair of Cairn and revitalisation of the area where it sits, including gravel and area being levelled out for buses and ANZAC Service. Hoping to achieve this by ANZAC Day 2026.

It was understood that the Shire had verbally agreed that if the BBPA source gravel, the Shire would spread it out.

Stage 2

Viewing deck where people can walk out for the view, including some information plaques.

Cuneo Drive

Cuneo Drive is not a gazetted road. To gazette the road, clearing and realignment would be required, this may have Native Title implications and would require approvals from State Government Departments.

5.5 Shire of Jerramungup

5.5.1 Bremer Bay Cultural and Civic Precinct Building

Bremer Bay is a growing community and to plan for the future, the Shire of Jerramungup is undertaking planning and feasibility to locate key community and civic services in a new building on Seadragon Avenue, next to the new Civic Square/Skatepark.

The aim is to design a high quality, vibrant, public building that creates a focal point for the town, is site responsive and enhances the character of Bremer Bay, integrates with surrounding sites and encourages activity, people to linger and a diverse range of formal and informal activities across the day and week by a wide range of people.

- The community survey closed this week.
- A workshop for the community was held on 27 July 2025, everyone was on the same page.
- A targeted survey of potential tenants, local groups, State Government and visiting professionals will be initiated.
- The Shire is running the project in conjunction with Consultants BlueSalt.
- High priority to establish what the precinct building might look like and who might go in there. Hoping to have this part completed in 2025. The cultural and civic building at Hopetoun is a good example of what we are aiming for.
- Funding will be sought for this project.

5.5.2 Bin Locations

Bins are being installed now that all concrete pads have been poured.

5.5.3 Public Access Way in front of the Bremer Bay Store

Rumble strips will be purchased now that the budget has been adopted.

5.5.4 Parking Signs across the road from the Bremer Bay Store

The Shire has installed blue parking signs across the road from the Store.

The ACROD parking bay at the Store was inspected. There is no pothole in the parking bay, water pools in an indentation on the ground surface. The Shire cannot repair this, as the carpark is the responsibility of the property owner.

5.5.5 Installation of Parks and Benches – Mary Street Park

Benches are being installed. Concrete pads have been poured.

5.5.6 Pelican Park

A park bench is being installed in Pelican Park. A concrete pad has been poured.

An assessment of the play equipment at Pelican Park established that it is no longer serviceable and should be replaced. The Shire is waiting on advice regarding how it should be removed. Council has allocated funds to progress the replacement including community consultation. In addition, external funding can be applied for as grants for play equipment are available. The basketball hoop will be retained. There will be an interim period where no play equipment, or bare minimum, will be in place at Pelican Park.

5.5.7 Request for a barrier to be installed at the end of the bike path as it meets Main Beach to slow bikes down.

This has been discussed and options are being considered.
